Course Description: Language Arts 7

Seventh grade Language Arts emphasizes reading and writing for a full year. In this standards-based curriculum, students will write compositions, understand and apply new vocabulary words, and prepare oral presentations. During reading instruction, students will apply a variety of comprehension strategies to develop meaning from the material they read. In writing instruction, emphasis will be placed on the 6+1 traits of writing: ideas and content, word choice, organization, sentence fluency, voice, conventions and format.
