
Attendance Counts

Research indicates that small improvements in attendance can yield large gains in academic performance. Help your student understand the link between attendance and success by making sure they are in school every day. Even students who complete their make-up work cannot replicate the activities and experiences they miss in class. If a student must be absent, a parent/guardian must notify the school every day of the absence.

In addition, students are expected to arrive to each class period, on-time, and prepared to work (this is a part of our second core value). Students who demonstrate a pattern of tardiness will receive disciplinary consequences and potential loss of privileges.

During the first week of school, we will be lenient, and will assist students in finding their classrooms. We understand that learning a new schedule takes time.

Lunch Periods



Students are assigned to one of three lunch periods. They have the option of bringing a lunch from home, or purchasing a meal from food services. Parents may put money in the student's lunch account, which students can access via a keypad in the cafeteria. Money may be added to student

accounts during Firebird Day, or via a link available on our school web site.

Please note that lunch lines can be long during the first few weeks of school. In order to avoid long lines, students may want to bring a lunch from home. However, we will make sure all students have the opportunity to eat lunch. Encourage them to see an adult if they do not have enough time.

First Day Supplies



Being prepared to learn with the right materials is the best way for students to achieve early success. Students should be prepared with the following supplies to begin classroom activities on the first day of school.

- One 3-4 inch (hard back) three-ring binder
- Minimum of 6 tabbed notebook dividers
- One pencil pouch that can be placed in the binder
- A minimum of 3 pens (blue or black ink)
- A minimum of 3 pencils
- Loose-leaf notebook paper

These materials may be purchased at Firebird Day on July 16th. All students will be required to have these materials, beginning the first day of school. Individual teachers may make additional requests, but they will communicate this information during the first week of school.

Athletics

Students interested in representing WJHS in our after school

sports program should complete an eligibility packet prior to the start of the athletic season. These packets include emergency contact and insurance information, as well as a sport's physical. Packets are available on the Willis web site (under Athletics), and can be completed online. Hard copies are available in the Willis front office.



Our first athletic season begins on Monday, July 27th. First season sports include:

- Co-Ed Flag Football
- Boy's Baseball
- Girl's Volleyball

Our athletic web site also has information about where to get sports physicals.

Purchase a Yearbook

Beginning Firebird Day, Thursday, July 16th, students will have the opportunity to pre-order their 2015—16 yearbook. More information about cost, and the pre-order process will be available on the 16th. Students who purchase a yearbook have the opportunity to attend a yearbook signing party at the end of the school year.

Dress for Academic Success

The district dress code is actively enforced at Willis. Dress code expectations are specifically outlined in the student agenda. However, we want to outline several issues related to student dress before students begin shopping for back to school clothes. The following items are prohibited on the Willis campus:

- Spaghetti strapped or see-through/sheer clothing (undergarments should never be visible)
- Tank tops (boys and girls)
- Short shorts (as a guide thumb length when arms are fully extended to the side)
- Clothing bearing the midriff, revealing cleavage or undergarments, or sagging below the waistline
- BLVD Palm Tree shirts (drug related)
- FATAL shirts with inappropriate images
- Unnatural color/combinations of color in hair
- Hats or headwear (beanies, bandanas, etc.)
- Shirts or jewelry promoting sex, drugs, alcohol, gangs, violence, weapons, etc.
- Belts hanging below the waist
- Piercings, other than earrings

Students who are in violation of the dress code will be asked to change, or call their parents to bring a change of clothes. Repeated violations will result in disciplinary action. We appreciate your early attention to compliance with these standards of dress.

Checking Students in and Out

To maintain student security, a parent/guardian must present a photo I.D. before the release of a student. Students may only be released to persons listed on the emergency card. All CUSD junior high schools are closed campuses. Students may not be released to anyone other than the parent/guardian during the lunch period. Sign in/out sheets are located in the front office.

To help us provide uninterrupted class sessions, please make every effort to communicate special pickup information to your student prior to the school day. If you contact the school office prior to picking up a student, we can issue a pass for the student to report to the office, thereby avoiding calling into the classroom for a student. One-hour advance notice is requested.

Academic Excellence

WJHS is proud to provide various levels of support and enrichment to our students.

Literacy & Math

Students needing support in academics have several options including: READ 180 Elective, Math 360



support class, Before School Reading class, or a daily reading or math intervention. Each is customized to the students' individual needs and taught by a highly qualified instructor. Technology and online curriculum is utilized in each class, ensuring engaging lessons and student growth.

Beyond Curriculum

All students have one period, Monday – Thursday, devoted specifically to academic perseverance and study skills. During this time, students receive reading/math interventions and/or Study Skills. Organization, goal-setting, time-management, and decision-making techniques are taught. This year, attention will be placed on using and taking quality notes. We are excited to help our students become life-long successful learners!

Transportation

Bus stop and route schedules will be provided by the CUSD Transportation Department prior to the first day of school. Families will receive this information in the mail with clear information pertaining to bus stops, pick-up times, and route numbers. Once issued, students must carry ID cards and show them to the bus driver in order to ride the bus.
