

Valedictorian/Salutatorian Process for BHS

- Class of 2015 and beyond
- GPA will be calculated based on the 22 credits required for graduation (44 grades)
- No grades lower than a C
- Must have taken a minimum of 12 credits at BHS

- Scores may be sent to colleges, NCAA, etc.

<u>Test Prep</u>

Academic Eligibility

- There are different academic requirements for each division of college
- DI or DII level you must register with the NCAA Eligibility Center
- If you want to compete at the NAIA level you now have to register with the NAIA Eligibility Center
- NJCAA and DIII do not require registration

NCAA Clearinghouse

How and when do I register for the NCAA Clearinghouse?

- Register at the end of your Junior year
- Go to <u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u> (web3.ncaa.org)
- Register- follow prompts
- Send your ACT/SAT Scores using the code (9999)
- Send your transcripts to the clearinghouse at the end of your junior year and your final transcripts at the end of your Senior year.
- There is a fee to register
- Fee Waivers are available

NAIA Clearinghouse

How and when do I register for the NAIA Clearinghouse?

- Register *anytime during your Senior year* at <u>www.naiaeligibilitycenter.org</u> (playnaia.org)
- You'll create a profile and fill out a personal profile
- Send your transcripts to the clearinghouse
- Send your ACT/SAT Scores to the clearinghouse using the code (9876)
- There is a fee to register
- Fee Waivers are available

Northern Arizona University Lumberjack Scholarship

- Tuition Waiver to NAU
- Renewable for all 4 years
- 3.5 GPA core
- Equal number of A's and B's for core
 – or more
 A's
- Time to consider replacing any C grades
- Limited number of retakes allowed
- See your counselor if you think you qualify!

Impact Chandler Schools

- College scholarship/leadership opportunity through the Chandler Education Foundation
- Must maintain a 3.4 unweighted GPA all 4 years.
- Must have 95% attendance
- Must complete at least 100 hours of community service throughout high school
- 35 hours are due by the end of 10th grade
- Essay contest for scholarship
- Must have enrolled your Freshman year

Graduation Honors

- NHS- 3.8 weighted GPA, attend meetings
- *High Honors-* 3.5 weighted GPA at end of 7th semester, 6.0 credits of honors classes- one during the senior year
- Distinguished Scholar- 3.8 weighted GPA at end of 7th semester, NHS member, 6.0 credits of honors classes- one during the senior year and 24 total credits

AZ Academic Scholar

- 18 Core Courses
- 4 Eng; 4 math, 3 science (physics preferred); 3 social studies; 2 foreign language- must be earned during high school years; 2 years CTE or fine arts
- "C" or better in each core course
- Seal on diploma

Summer Before Senior Year



- Continue researching colleges- get a feel for what works for you (large, small, public, and private)
- Enrich yourself by volunteering, internship, work, or special learning programs, summer school
- Narrow college choices
- In-Person visits when possible/Summer opportunities at colleges
- Resume/Personal Statement
- Search for on-line scholarships
- Schedule Senior Portrait

Prepare for College Applications

- Review credits with your counselor
- Narrow your list of colleges (Get application and financial aid information from each)
- Pay attention to due dates/deadlines
- Write application essays- have someone read first drafts
- Ask for recommendations (if required and provide enough time)
- Take/Retake ACT/SAT if appropriate
- Take SAT II Subject Tests if appropriate
- Continue Scholarship search online & at BHS
- Get Financial Aid Information/CSS Profile/FAFSA

Avoid the Senior Slump! Look for Graduation info- snr portrait, cap/gown, etc. Pay all debts and fines

Apply Early/ Apply Right

The college application includes:

- 1. Application
- 2. Test Scores
- 3. Transcript
- 4. Essay (if required)
- Fill out applications
- Apply for orientations /housing
- Utilize Common Application/Universal College Application when applicable
- Submit by deadlines- *earlier* is better (research your particular college(s) for specific requirements and timeline)
- Keep copies of everything you send

Academic record of semester grades and select standardized test scores.

Most Colleges will not come to YOU!





• FAFSA- (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

* APPLY EARLY * (online) - now Prior Prior Year – October of Snr Year

- Applying early increases your chances for grants and other sorts of financial aid.
- Remember- Some schools won't consider you for merit scholarships until you've submitted a FAFSA, so complete one even if you think you won't qualify for federal aid
- Find out the priority filing date for the college or universities you applying to
- Must renew application every year

Note: Federal Student Aid PIN# used to access federal aid systems has changed to FSA ID.

The new FSA ID consists of a user-created username and password to electronically access personal information on Federal Student Aid Web sites, including *FAFSA on the Web*. You can use your FSA ID immediately to sign your FAFSA, but must wait for the Social Security Administration (SSA) to verify your information before you can use the FSA ID to create a renewal FAFSA, make corrections to your FAFSA, or view your SAR.

President's Honors Scholarship Maricopa Community Colleges (any of the 10) What is it? 60 free credits for fall and spring semesters (no summer) Must take 1 honors class per semester **Parking included** Student responsible for books and lab fees

Criteria is being revised by Community College system at this time. Tied to an Accuplacer score. Final determination is due out within the next month. Information will be available in the Career Center as well as through MCCCD



The Waiting Game.

- Wait for admission decisions
- Choose your college
- Plan for budgeting needs, housing, sign up for orientations, etc...
- Continue to search for scholarships
- Look for financial aid information (website, update if necessary –list of schools and tax information)

- Take AP Exams
- Complete all Senior courses
- Final transcript request (NCAA, NAIA too)
- Final transcript from CC (dual credit)
- Prepare for <u>Graduation!</u>
