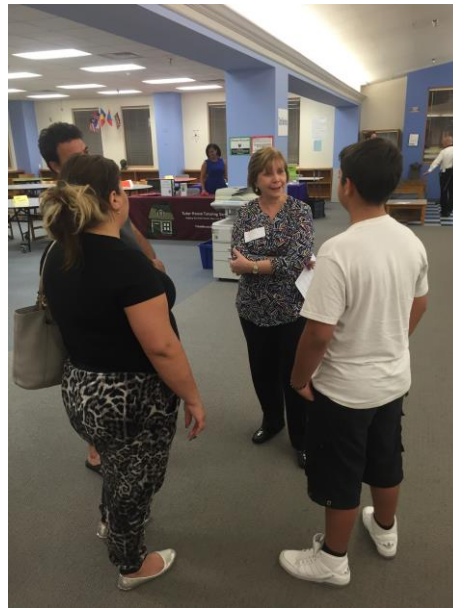
WORLD LANGUAGE FAIR RECAP
