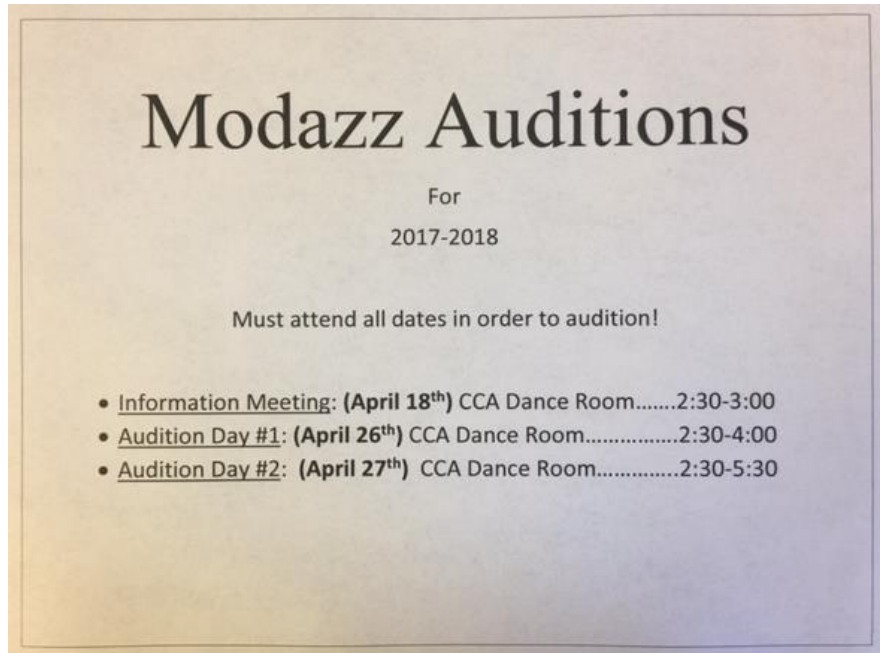
## **IMPORTANT INFO FOR GRADUATING SENIORS**
