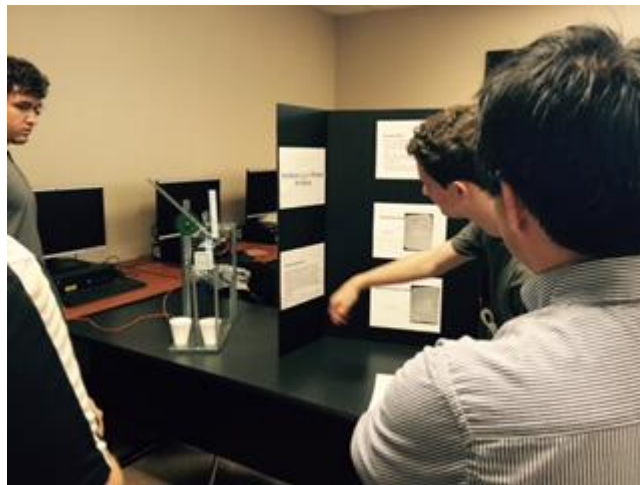
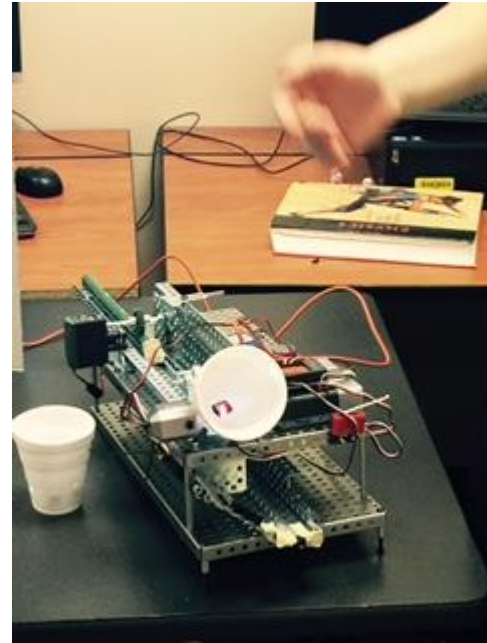
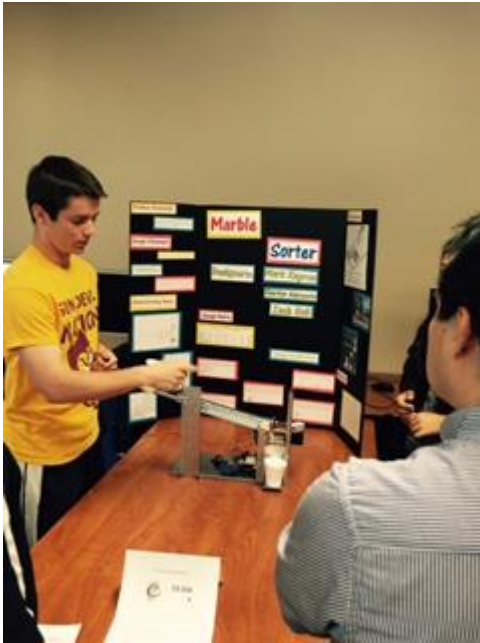
FINAL CHOIR PERFORMANCE OF THE YEAR

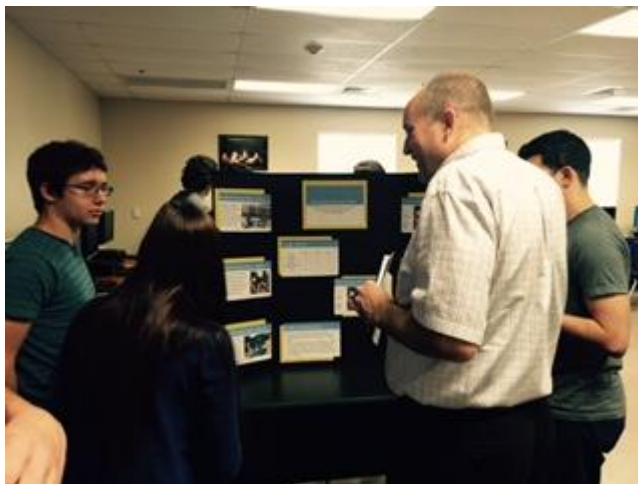

ENGINEERING FINAL PROJECT DEMO

Mrs. Shugert's Second Level Engineering students have been learning programming (coding), starting with MATLAB, then RobotC (a combination of Java and C languages). Their final task was to design, build, test, and write the code for a Marble Sorter (fifteen marbles- 8 clear and 7 black) using VEX Robotics Kits. Engineers from INTEL and the private sector judged groups' projects and presentations.





AP ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE SOLAR CARS

Solar Energy is the "Way of the Future!" This statement is what students hear and see on the news and in the classroom from ongoing debates and discussions with teachers and students alike. Time and time again, the question is asked, "If solar energy is our best solution to rid us of our oil dependency, then why do we not see it extensively used in the state of Arizona as a main source of energy provided to homes and on vehicles?" After all, Arizona is ranked number one in the United States in receiving the most amount of sunshine, according to meteorological data, with an average of 306 days of sunshine. Students were asked to create a solar car and race it with other students in class by answering the essential question, "How can society apply solar power to better their energy efficiency in their homes and vehicles?"



SUMMER SCHOOL

Summer School information is now available in the Counseling Office. Summer Academy will be held at Chandler High School. Students should see their counselor for the paperwork. Students interested in summer classes through Chandler Online Academy must have an email registered in Infinite Campus (IC) or bring the info to their counselor for data input. This year the online registration will go through IC, and only the counselors have access. After the counselor inputs the request, an email will go to the parent for payment.

Summer Academy is Monday, June 8th through Friday, June 26th from 7:30am-4:00pm. Fees are \$180 per semester course. There is a two course maximum for "in person" and a four course maximum for online. Students who miss more than two days will be purged from the system with no refund, so please plan vacations accordingly.
