PRINCIPAL'S ACADEMIC HONORS RECOGNITION

On Monday, May 11th, CHS will celebrate academics and rigor by recognizing 650 CHS students who have maintained a 3.5 GPA and have met the following requirements for enrollment in honor classes each semester:

Freshmen Two honors credits (4 semester courses-grade 9)
Sophomores Four honors credits (8 semester courses-grades 9-10)
Juniors Five honors credits (10 semester courses-grades 9-11)
Seniors Six honors credits (12 semester courses-grades 9-12)

Students must be enrolled in at least one honors class during the spring semester, and during each semester grades 9-12. If the student is enrolled in honors courses in the spring semester, those courses are counted toward this requirement.

During 2nd hour, Mr. Rother will appear in a special video announcement, and teachers will distribute certificates and programs to recipients. Academic Honors Scholars will be released to lunch early to receive their "CHS Scholar" t-shirts and other goodies. We've planned a special day for the scholars, and we look forward to recognizing them in front of their peers. SUMMER SCHOOL

Summer School information is now available in the Counseling Office. Summer Academy will be held at Chandler High School. Students should see their counselor for the paperwork. Students interested in summer classes through Chandler Online Academy must have an email registered in Infinite Campus (IC) or bring the info to their counselor for data input. This year the online registration will go through IC, and only the counselors have access. After the counselor inputs the request, an email will go to the parent for payment.

Summer Academy is Monday, June 8th through Friday, June 26th from 7:30am-4:00pm. Fees are \$180 per semester course. There is a two course maximum for "in person" and a four course maximum for online. Students who miss more than two days will be purged from the system with no refund, so please plan vacations accordingly.

CHS DUAL ENROLLMENT

Chandler High School offers 35 Dual Enrollment classes. Earn college credit while taking classes in high school and complete many university general studies requirements. See Mrs. Shaw in the Counseling Department if you have any questions regarding dual enrollment.

INTERNET SAFETY PRESENTATION

Are you aware of what your child is doing online? What can you do to keep your children safe online? Do you have concerns about internet safety? The Internet is a huge information source and a valuable tool for adults and children, but because of its anonymous nature it creates opportunities for predators.

71% of teen ages 13-17 reported receiving messages online from someone they didn't know.

40% reported that they usually reply and chat with that person.

30% of teens have considered meeting someone that they have chatted with.

14% have actually had such an encounter.
