




Only the four core subjects and world language grades from the students' previous year's transcript are used to calculate GPA weights; not specials such as CTE, PE or Music.

- 8th Grade Team: 3 Honors Students, 3 Scholastic Students, 3 Varsity Students
- 7th Grade Team: 3 Honors Students, 3 Scholastic Students, 3 Varsity Students
- 6th Grade Team: 3 Honors Students, 3 Scholastic Students, 3 Varsity Students
- Students compete on the "A team, B, C, or D teams" or as individuals.
- We are looking for 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students to fill spots on multiple teams.
- All students can earn medals if they achieve the 3 highest scores, regardless of team/IND status.
- All students who choose to compete must compete in all 5 academic subjects.
 - You can not pick and choose. Some are specialists and medal in one or two subjects (math & science)
 - Some are true pentathletes and will medal in 3-5 subjects an Overall Champion is also awarded a medal.
 - This is a good experience for the individual and prepares them for future team participation.





Only the four core subjects and world language grades from the students' previous year's transcript are used to calculate GPA weights; not specials such as CTE, PE or Music.

A full team consists of 3 honor, 3 scholastic and 3 varsity students.

A team can only win with at least 2 teammates in all three weight divisions.

- provides an opportunity for students who are academically interested regardless of GPA
- shows the students at a young age that grades are not necessarily an indicator of intelligence and that they should strive to work with students at all levels
- Students also experience that often the person with the highest GPA is not necessarily the smartest person in the room. I have been pleasantly surprised at how some of our "C" students have scored higher than many of the "A" students.



 develops a tolerance for different talents in peers and a greater ability for collaboration


Team Composition:

- 6th graders can participate as 7th or 8th graders
- 7th graders can participate as 7th or 8th graders
- 8th graders participate on an 8th grade team or as 8th grade individuals.





- We can field one official 6th, one official 7th and one official 8th grade team. ("A" Teams)
- Students who are not on the official "A" team can be placed on "B, C, or D" teams.
- Even if a student is not on the A or B team, they can win individual medals.
 - All students who choose to compete, must compete in all 5 academic subjects.
 - Most schools struggle to create one team. We have many teams, making us that much more competitive!
 - In 2024 we sent 44 students to nationals. 3 teams and 27 individuals. Never give up!




Format for Competitions:

• 5 multiple choice tests + 1 essay (typed – no spell or grammar check)



 Top 2/3 from each academic GPA category from each team counts toward team score= 30,000 possible points/Team
