# CHOIR CLASSES AT BHS

All choirs at BHS will explore a variety of choral repertoire and receive instruction in healthy vocal production, sight-reading, music theory skills and best performance practices. Each ensemble will perform a minimum of four times throughout the school year and may have the opportunity for additional performances locally and nationally. Choir members will also be eligible to audition for State events and festivals.

The Grace Notes: A non-auditioned ensemble for treble voices in grades 9-12.

Counterpoint: An auditioned mixed-voice ensemble (SATB) for students in grades 9-12.

Noteworthy: An auditioned chamber and jazz choir for mixed voices (SATB) in grades 9-12. Requires

concurrent enrollment in Counterpoint.

## GRADING POLICIES

## **SEMESTER GRADES:**

The course semester grades are weighted as follows:

Quarter 1: 40% Quarter 2: 40% Final Exam: 20%

## FINAL EXAM:

The Final Exam for choir will consist of a student project as assigned by Dr. Brooke.

# QUARTER GRADES:

The individual quarter grades are weighted as follows:

Participation: 50% Assignments + Quizzes + Tests: 20% Performances: 30%

# PARTICIPATION:

Active participation and professional behavior is both rewarded and reflected in your grade. A model student is on time and present, prepared, attentive to instruction and engaged in the rehearsal process.

Choir classes require active participation for group accomplishment. As such, daily attendance is vitally important and is reflected in the participation grade. If you need to miss a rehearsal (class period), please communicate with Dr. Brooke, preferably prior to missing the rehearsal. Further, to be on time and present is to be in your assigned seat with all materials by the last bell. Additionally, off-task behavior, lack of participation, tardies and being unprepared are also reflected in this grade.

Participation grades may only be made-up for excused absences. A hard copy of the Participation Make-Up Work worksheet will need to be submitted to Dr. Brooke within 3 school days of the absence. When absent, it is the student's responsibility to check with another student to receive any missed rehearsal notes.

# ASSIGNMENTS + QUIZZES + TESTS:

Assignments, quizzes and tests will be administered throughout the quarter with Dr. Brooke ensuring each student is well-prepared for success. Grades will be posted in Infinite Campus following the due date.

## PERFORMANCES:

Performances are a celebration of an ensemble's diligent work and accomplishments. As choir classes are performance-based, concert attendance is mandatory. There will be at least one performance opportunity and associated grade per semester, with the possibility of additional performances. Should a situation arise causing a student to miss a performance, accommodations may be made on a case-by-case basis. *However, accommodations will only be granted if communicated to Dr. Brooke PRIOR to the performance.* 

# MAKE-UP + LATE WORK:

Professionalism is constantly reflected through time-management skills and is why work is expected to be submitted on time. However, students will have the amount of time missed due to an *excused* absence to submit work for full credit. Partial credit *may* be granted for late work up to 3 school days following the due date.

## Extra Credit:

For students in need of extra points, credit may be earned by attending a classical musical event (vocal recitals, ensemble concerts or a musical). To earn the credit, the student will need to submit a performance program signed by a parent/guardian.
