Course Overview

Course Description

This course is the first year of a standards-based mathematics curriculum. Number sense topics include understanding and applying for numbers, ways of representing numbers, and the relationships among numbers and different number systems. Data analysis focuses on understanding and applying data collection, organization, and representation to analyze and sort data. Algebra topics focus on representing and analyzing mathematical situations and structures using algebraic expressions. Geometric topics include specifying and describing spatial relationships using coordinate geometry and other representational systems. Design and logic focus on algorithms and algorithmic thinking and using reasoning to solve mathematical problems in contextual situations. Students will use the standards for mathematical practice to engage with the subject matter

Late work

All late homework and quizzes should be turned in before the unit test on the topic.

Tests must be made up within 5 school days.

To be eligible for quiz replacement and group testing, students must have no missing assignments for the current unit.

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

Quarter grades

Homework, classwork, and warm ups will account for 15% of the students quarter grade. Tests, Projects, and Quizzes will account for 85% of the students quarter grade. -Students will have the opportunity to make quiz corrections until the day of the unit test to recover half

the missed points.

- Students may also use quiz replacement if they score higher on the unit test than a quiz as long as there are no missing assignments in the unit.

-Group Tests will be offered occasionally prior to an individual unit test. Students may work with a group on this portion of the test only if they have no missing assignments in the unit.

-Students not eligible for group test, will complete this assessment individually.

Semester grades

Semester grades are calculated using 40/40/20: Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
