THE SCHOOL

Hamilton High School, established in 1998 is a four-year (grades 9-12) comprehensive high school located in the southeastern part of the city of Chandler, Arizona. The school follows a district-wide modified year-round calendar. Hamilton High School offers outstanding curriculum, comprehensive fine arts and athletics programs, and a wide variety of extra curricular activities. State of the art technology enhances students’ learning, presentation, and research capabilities. Students at Hamilton High School are expected to make use of an array of technological tools to enhance their learning. Computer labs are available which allows students to develop their own interactive presentations using sound, video, animation, graphics, and texts. In keeping with the school’s philosophy, an integrated curriculum is a primary goal.

THE DISTRICT

Chandler Unified School District consists of 31 elementary schools, including five traditional schools, seven junior high schools and six high schools. The total student population is over 44,000. The U.S. Department of Education has recognized many of the schools in the district as National Schools of Excellence. The Chandler Unified School District has many partnerships with local companies that provide technology, internship, and teacher training. There are more than 4,000 people employed in the school district. Students are transported by a central bus system.

THE COMMUNITY

The city of Chandler is in the southeastern part of Maricopa County, approximately 20 miles from Phoenix. One of the fastest growing communities in the nation, the population of Chandler in 2020 was over 269,000. The economic base of Chandler is diversified. Chandler has a strong economic base including manufacturing, electronics, financial institutions, and biosciences. Major companies such as Intel, Motorola, Wells Fargo Corporate Headquarters Microchip, Orbital Sciences and Charles Schwab maintain facilities in Chandler. The population is young and well educated with 78% of adults having some college education.

CURRICULUM

The academic program is organized on a modified block schedule. A full class load is 6 credits. Monday Tuesday and Friday students attend six classes (periods 1-6) for 56 minutes in length. On Wednesdays, students attend periods 1-3-5 and on Thursdays attend periods 2-4-6 for 112 minutes in length.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Hamilton High School was recognized by *Newsweek* magazine as one of the top 800 high schools in America and received the Siemens Award as the number one Advanced Placement High School in the studies of math and science in the state of Arizona. Hamilton had 476 AP Scholars in 2021-2022, 242 with distinction.

Courses are offered in: English Language and Literature, Calculus AB and BC, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, U.S. History, both U.S. and Comparative Government and Politics, Macroeconomics, Human Geography, French, German, and Chinese Language, Spanish Language and Literature, Psychology, Java, Computer Science, Studio Art (2D, 3D and Drawing), History of Art, Music Theory, Seminar and Research. In 2021-2022 approximately 1450 students were enrolled in AP courses. This past May Hamilton administered more than 2250 exams with an AP test passing rate of 91%, which is among the highest number of exams given in a public high school in Arizona.

Other Sports offered include Cross-Country, Boys and Girls Tennis, Swim and Dive, Wrestling, Badminton, Pom, Girls Volleyball, Track and Softball. Hamilton has won three prestigious awards from the AIA. In 2010-2011 and again in 2015, Hamilton was awarded the H.A. Hendrickson Award, an award of excellence naming Hamilton as Arizona’s outstanding 4A/5A School. In 2011-2012 Hamilton was awarded the Tony Komadina Award of Excellence for outstanding girl’s athletic programs.
