





# **Program Eligibility:**

### In School:

- · Must be between the ages of 14-21 and
- Be considered low-income (for example, receiving SNAP or free/reduced lunch) and

Answer YES to at least one of the following:

- · Have you ever been arrested or in jail?
- Are you homeless?
- Are you currently in foster care, or have you aged out of foster care?
- Do you have any children or are you currently pregnant?
- Do you have a disability?
- Are you an English Language Learner?

### Out of School:

- Must be between the ages of 16-24 and Answer YES to at least one of the following:
- Did you drop out of high school and have not been able to get your GED or diploma?
- Have you ever been arrested or in jail?
- Are you homeless?
- Are you currently in foster care, or have you aged out of foster care?
- Do you have any children or are you currently pregnant?
- Do you have a disability?

If you don't meet the eligibility requirements above, contact us to explore other ways you might qualify.



Get paid at a minimum of \$16 an hour.

\*If you complete 320 hours successfully or get hired at a WEX site prior to the 320 hour completion, you may qualify for an additional \$500 incentive.


