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Class Overview

¡Bienvenidos! Welcome to Spanish! This course is a continuation from last year's Spanish class. In this class we will continue to immerse ourselves in the culture and language of Spanish speaking people around the world. You will continue to develop more vocabulary, grammar, communication skills concepts in Spanish, and various aspects of Hispanic culture through listening, speaking, reading and writing.

Classwork

- ✓ Classwork may be, but is not limited to worksheets, audio, video activities, group work, projects, book work, role-playing, pair work, songs, educational games, and presentations.
- ✓ You will work in groups of 2-4 on a weekly basis. Partners will be changed frequently so that you can familiarize yourself with as many of your classmates as possible.

Homework/Assignments

- ✓ You need to study your **vocabulary and verbs at home daily**. A foreign language needs to be reinforced **daily** to master the concepts learned in class. You should commit 15-30 minutes each night reviewing your Spanish vocabulary even when written homework has not been assigned.
- ✓ If you are having trouble with an assignment, come in during tutoring before school for help. Please email me with any worries, concerns or clarification of assignments.
- ✓ All work needs to have your name, day and period. Work with no name will receive no points. late work deduction will apply to No Name work.
- ✓ Late work will be accepted up to one week before Progress Reports and one week before the end of the Quarter.
- ✓ Late work deductions: 1 day late = 25% off, 2 days late = 50% off, and 3+ days late = 75% off

Participation

To learn a language, you must speak that language at every opportunity. Our classroom is a great place to do that. Your participation in class is essential to learn Spanish. You can gain or lose points depending on your attitude, participation, use of class time, organization, responsibility, preparedness, behavior, and use of Spanish. Participation points will be awarded for: starting your daily work, being ready for class, speaking Spanish, participating in activities, showing effort, going above and beyond, and more.

Test/Quizzes

- ✓ There will be an evaluation (quiz) every two weeks on the current chapter, vocabulary, verbs, listening and reading comprehension, and/or class work.
- ✓ If you did not master the material on a quiz, you are encouraged to retake it during tutoring. You are allowed two quiz retakes per quarter and the highest grade you can get on your retake is 80%. You have 5 school days from the date of your quiz to take a retake. Complete the retake form. Parents/Guardian must sign it. Attached it to your old quiz.

Tutoring

Tuesday and Friday before school 8:15am - 8:55am. Tutoring is recommended if you are struggling or need help with homework or classwork. Quizzes, tests and speaking evaluations should also be made up during tutoring.

Grading

- ✓ Your grade will reflect your **mastery of concepts and objectives**. Points will be given for various assignments/activities including tests/quizzes, classwork, speaking, projects/presentations, practice through participation, homework, etc.
- ✓ The grading scale is as follows: 90-100% = A, 80-89% = B, 70- 79% = C, 60-69% = D, 0-59% =F
- ✓ Go to Infinite Campus weekly to check your grades and progress.

Behavior

Our goal is to eliminate distractions, disruptions, and poor behavior, so we are free to learn. Any behavior that causes a disruption to the learning of any student will not be tolerated.

Class Expectations

1. Be on time, on task & prepared to learn every day.
2. Respect the teacher, the classroom, other students and yourself.
3. Be responsible for your own learning.
4. Clean up after yourself.
5. Keep all personal electronics put away.

I expect you to take responsibility for your own behavior. If you choose not to follow the classroom policies or rules mentioned above, you will be choosing the following consequences:

Consequences:

- ✓ 1st offense: verbal warning in class
- ✓ 2nd offense: complete a behavior log in the black book, staying after class to talk to the teacher and contact home.
- ✓ 3rd offense: sent to Reflection Room and contact home.
NOTE: The teacher reserves the right to skip steps 1 and 2 and move to step 3 based on the severity of the offense.
- ✓ See the student handbook for a list of offenses that may require an immediate behavior citation.

- ✓ **It is your responsibility** to find out what material you may have missed and turn in your work after any absences. You have one day per absence to make up your work. It is **solely up to you** to find out what you missed and turn it in.
