COLONEL CLIFFORD B. STANSELL

(Retired 1 August 2014)

Colonel Clifford B. Stansell was the vice commander of the Air Force Nuclear Weapons Center, Kirtland Air Force Base, N.M.. The center is composed of a headquarters staff, one wing and two wing-equivalent directorates: the 377th Air Base Wing and Nuclear Capabilities Directorate at Kirtland AFB; and the ICBM Systems Directorate at Hill AFB, Utah. The AFNWC comprises more than 3,500 Airmen at 11 locations in the United States and Europe and is responsible for the entire scope of nuclear weapons sustainment functions.

Before being assigned to Kirtland AFB, Colonel Stansell Served as Deputy Director, Logistics, Installations, and Mission Support, Air Force Global Strike Command. In this capacity, he ensured the readiness of Minuteman III intercontinental ballistic missiles, B-2 and B-52 bombers, and UH-1 helicopters. Colonel Stansell entered the Air Force in 1984, serving more than three years as a jet engine mechanic. After his commissioning as a distinguished graduate of Officer Training School in 1988, he held various positions, including command at the squadron and group levels, duties as an ICBM launch officer, service in multiple fighter/bomber maintenance positions, and duty on both the Air Staff and Joint Staff.
