## **Student Conduct, Success, and Responsibilities**

### **Student Responsibilities**

**CLOTHES:** Label your clothes uniform with your initials.

**INJURIES/ABSENCES:** Parent notes are not accepted...You must still dress out! Communicate with me to discuss the severity of your medical or physical excuse, and we'll come up with a plan. Doctor excuses are permitted – and required - after three or more days of not participating in class. Students must dress out and/or complete alternative activities to receive credit for every class they miss.

**MEDICAL:** If a student uses an inhaler, s/he must bring it to class and participate to the best of his/her ability.

**CELL PHONE:** NO CELL PHONE USE IN THE LOCKER ROOMS OR DURING ACTIVITIES!! IF a student has a cell phone out during class it will be confiscated and given to security to be picked up at the end of the day.

**SCHOOL LOCK and LOCKERS:** Each student is issued a school lock and locker to use for the year. If the lock is lost, the student must pay a \$10 replacement fee to the bookstore, then a replacement lock will be issued by the teacher/coach. Keep the combination a secret to prevent theft. **DO NOT SHARE IT WITH YOUR CLASSMATES!** You **MUST** lock your belongings in your locker. Keep your lock and locker locked at all times. If your belongings are stolen, but they weren't locked up, I can't help you. You must use the lock provided to you; you may not bring your own lock. CUSD and Casteel High School are not responsible for the students' belongings. Any articles remaining in a locker once a student is no longer enrolled in junior high PE are not the school's responsibility. Such items will be kept for a short period of time and then will be donated. Aerosol cans (hairspray, deodorant, perfume, etc.) are not permitted in the locker room.

**LOCKER ROOM and DRESSING OUT:** Enter the locker room respectfully and get dressed quickly. Do not dress in the toilet stalls. This takes away from people who need to use them accordingly. Please keep clothes laundered. The expectation is that PE clothes will be taken home on Friday, washed, and returned Monday for class. No gum. No food or drink allowed in the locker room. Stay out of the locker room during lunch. Students needing to use the restroom will be directed to the outside bathrooms by the lunch area. They will need to obtain a pass from the teacher prior to leaving for the restroom. No horseplay of any kind will be tolerated in the locker room.

**TECHNOLOGY:** With the 1:1 technology initiative, it is the responsibility of the student to bring their fully charged laptop to school every day. Technology is a tool no different than a pencil. Like all school supplies, students are expected to have the supplies needed to learn.

**DISCIPLINE PROTOCOL:** It is the expectation that students hold themselves to high standards. The teacher will address students who are not meeting these expectations. Typical classroom behaviors consequences these are they standard progression for discipline

Our goal is to work with families to ensure that all students have a safe and focused learning environment.

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**TARDY PROTOCOL:** Students are expected to be in the locker room when the bell rings and ready to learn. If a student is tardy to class teachers will follow this process to rectify students being late to class.

a warning on their first and second offense.

the teacher will email / call home.

Notify Attendance Interventionist and email / call home.

On the fifth offense, the teacher will refer the student to our Attendance Interventionist, who can work with families and assign Saturday school if necessary.

The teacher has the option to provide their own lunch detention at their discretion instead of writing a conduct referral.

**FOOD AND DRINK:** There is no food or drink allowed in the locker room except water.

**TUTORING:** Available upon request

**FINAL EXAMS:** Finals are not given early. Absent students will receive a zero until they can take the final.

### **Late work**

Students who have excused absences have at least one day, every day they are absent, to make up the work they missed. The make-up assignment for excused absences is located in the google classroom. Excessive absences can result in the loss of a credit for the course.

## **Assessments and Assignments**

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the [District Calendar](#).

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

### **Quarter grades**

Students are awarded 15 points a day. They earn 5 points for being on time, 5 points for being dressed out, and 5 points for participation.

In addition they receive a character matters grade.

### **Semester grades**

Semester grades are calculated using 40/40/20: Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
