Students 11 years of age and older will be **REQUIRED** to have one dose of <u>Meningococcal</u> (Meningitis) vaccine.

GENERAL SCHOOL INFORMATION

<u>Chandler Unified is paperless</u>. Communication will be sent through email, please make sure the office has your current/correct email address.

<u>STUDENT</u> PICK UP/BUS PASSES –Due to overcrowding on busses, students may not ride a bus home that they are not assigned to.

On special occasions, if it is necessary to have someone (friend/family member) pick up your child(ren) at school, please send a note to school and have your child(ren) give it to their classroom teacher. If you forget, a parent phone call will be sufficient......please <u>NO calls after 2:00 p.m.</u>. Individuals listed on your emergency card are for emergency (injury/sick incidents) and are not considered a blanket approval by parents for all occasions.

If you need to pick up your student early, the office will call the student down when you have signed them out in the office. We will no longer call students down after 2:30 pm or prior to a parent signing them out in the office.

<u>MEDICATION – SCHOOL/DISTRICT POLICIES -</u> A consent form for giving prescription and non-prescription medicines are available in the health office or online. Prescriptions require a doctor's signature on the form and the form must be presented with the medicine in the health office. Non-prescription medicine requires a parent signature only and must be in the original unopened container. ALL medications prescribed 3 or fewer times per day are not given at school <u>unless a time is specified</u> in writing by the doctor's order.

In order for your child to be given a NON-ASPIRIN (Acetaminophen-Tylenol) at school, please fill out the emergency card on the parent portal. Students will not be given Aceteminophen-Tylenol unless it is checked "OK to give" on the Emergency Card each year. Tylenol can not be given the 1st and last hour of the day. We need your help in ensuring that your child is in school every day. There is no substitute for time spent in the classroom. When illness or an emergency makes it necessary for your child to be absent, please call the attendance line at 812-7503 (Attendance Line Available 24 Hours). Remember to report the absence with the following information:

- Child's name and grade
- Reason for absence (flu, cold, cough, etc
- Relationship to the student (mother, father, aunt, etc.)
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STUDENT PERSONAL ITEMS – Please make sure that your child's lunch container, backpack, binder, etc. are labeled with his /her full name. **Toys of any kind such as; radios, hand-held computer games, fidget spinners, and boom boxes are not allowed** at school. However, there may be special times during the school year that your child's teacher gives special permission for these items. If your child brings any of these items from home, Weinberg School cannot be responsible for damage or loss.

TARDY STUDENTS - Make sure to have your child come directly to the office to sign-in and receive a tardy pass before going to his/her assigned classroom. When the first bell rings @ 8:30a.m., students line-up with their class and walk together to their classroom. If children arrive after 8:35 a.m., they are considered late and must report to the office with a parent/guardian who will sign the student in before going to the classroom. To be recognized for perfect attendance, students must have 0 absences and tardies. Please make every effort to have your child ride the bus or be dropped off by 8:30a.m..



TRAFFIC PATTERN AND DIRECTIONS

Safety is top priority. Please review the following procedures and make a commitment to follow them.

Thank you for following our established traffic patterns.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE

Don't arrive at Weinberg until 8:10 AM for drop-off and do not arrive until 3:00PM for dismissal.

Grades K-1 and older siblings of those students enter our West lot from Val Vista to Appleby.

Grade 2 – 6 who do not have younger siblings will take Queen Creek east of Val Vista, turn South on 156th to Appleby then turn right (going west) to the east parking lot.

ALL PARENTS.....

Observe all the **"NO PARKING ZONES and Red Zones"**. **Do not leave your car unattended unless you have parked in an established parking space**. Pull into your assigned lot and stay single file to the right. Pull as far forward as possible – even if you think no one is coming up behind you. This allows us to load or unload from the passenger side directly to the curb. Please remember that the entrance to Ledge Ridge community is private property (off Key Biscayne and Appleby). Please do not park and wait for pick up your children there. I encourage you to use the drive through lane.

Be patient with each other and our Staff!

Dogs In Grade Schools (DIGS)

Weinberg has partnered with DIGS to help make school a happy place! A therapy dog will be at Weinberg every day. The therapy dogs will be used to support our students with the hope of increasing daily attendance, relieving test anxiety, increasing empathy and improving social interaction. We will be collecting metrics (comparing to previous years) in the areas of attendance, discipline, and school climate. Only nationally certified Pet Therapy teams will be participating in the program. All dogs pass a stringent test every two years, have health certificates and must be groomed within 24-hours of being on campus. All dogs must remain on-leash at all times and only certain breeds with proven temperaments will become DIGS dogs. Dogs will only approach a child or adult when they receive permission. Please let your teacher know if you have any concerns about having your child around the dogs.

As Manager of Volunteer Services (11 years) for a major hospital system in Arizona, she led 770 volunteers/volunteens, a 12-member volunteer board, and two gift shops; all with four staff members.

Barb Farmer is a veteran of the United States Marine Corps. She volunteers with her certified pet therapy dog ScooterPie. She was recently appointed to the Town of Gilbert, Chamber of Commerce Gilbert Leadership Board and Co-Chaired the East Valley Marine Corps League Toys for Tots 2017/2018.

Shoes and attire:


Please make sure to come prepared for P.E. with appropriate closed toe shoes that are tied and comfortable clothing! You can also wear a hat!!
