Dear Wrangler Families,

The first quarter seems to have flown by. It is gratifying to see how much our students grow each quarter. At the start of the year, there is a clear focus on expectations, and now, they are well settled into the routines and procedures at school. While the second quarter is filled with fun school events and holidays, we will continue to keep our focus on student learning.

We finally have relief from the unrelenting heat of summer. However, the cooler weather brings on illnesses which may require students to stay home. To minimize absences, we ask that vacations are scheduled when school is on break. Most of the learning happens in the classroom where concepts are taught and students engage in activities that allow them to actively participate in the learning process. Teachers are very intentional in their planning of lessons and spend considerable time to develop lessons that capture students' interest, while taking into account their skills and areas of need. Keeping absences to a minimum reduces learning gaps and frustration for students.

TIME TO UPDATE

Reminder --- to update your Emergency Cards for the 2018-2019 school year.

You can access your students Emergency Card through the parent portal and click on the Emergency and Health update. You will need to click on every pleat of every section in order to update the emergency card. If you have more than one student, you will need to complete one for each student. \$400 STATE TAX CREDIT



Arizona law ARS 43-1089.01 enables taxpayers a tax credit contribution of up to \$400.00 per calendar year if filing status is Married, filing Joint Return; \$200.00 per calendar year if filing status is Single or Head of Household; and, \$200.00 per calendar year if filing status is Married filing separate return — for contributions that fund extracurricular activities in public schools. A tax credit is a full refund, not a deduction. You may make this contribution anytime between now and December 31, 2018, to be eligible for your 2018 taxes. 

Maricopa County Health Regulations

Maricopa County Environmental Health Code Regulations 3-201.II, food prepared from home may not be used or offered for consumption in any food establishment. ALL CUSD sites/schools are classified as food establishments by the Maricopa County Office of Environmental Health Services.

If you would like to bring purchased treats, please make sure you check with the teacher regarding food allergies in the classroom. The teacher will determine the time of celebration based on their schedule for the day.

STUDENT CELL PHONES & CELLPHONE WATCH

Per Chandler Unified District policy, cell phones are allowed if they are turned off and left in student backpacks throughout the school day. Students are not allowed to use their phones to text. TRAFFIC TRAFFIC

When using the drive through lanes, please remain in your cars as you pull forward along the curb where students load and unload.

Kinder parents - we ask that you do not stop at the curve by the kinder playground. This causes more cars to be lined up in the street. Please pull forward all the way, and our safety patrol and staff will make sure the children reach the playground.

Also, please avoid parking next to the red curbs. We have added a "red curb – no parking" area in the west and east parking lots. Our large vendor and district delivery trucks need that room to safely enter and exit the parking lots. This is also a fire lane designated for emergency vehicles.

PARKING

During school hours, you can park along the yellow painted area known as the "student dropoff and parent pick-up" curbing. This is only for the hours between 8:50AM-2:00PM. This may be helpful for many of you who are coming to volunteer and visit.

NEW IMMUNIZATION RULES

I am writing to inform you of 2 new immunization rules from the Arizona Department of Health Services that will affect your child. The new rules were just released 8/31/18 and now have different requirements than when parents were notified at the beginning of this school year. In short, they have removed the grade level from the requirements and now require these vaccines by age 11.

- Students 11 years of age and older will be **REQUIRED** to have one dose of <u>Tdap</u> vaccine if 5 years has passed since their last dose of Tetanus/diphtheria containing vaccine.
- Students 11 years of age and older will be **REQUIRED** to have one dose of *Meningococcal* (Meningitis) vaccine.

Please make appointments now with your physician to avoid being excluded from attending school due to noncompliance. Students will have 14 days to get the required immunizations after they turn 11 years old to remain in compliance with the new rules. Students without the required vaccines will not be allowed to attend school once they become noncompliant, until they receive the required vaccines.

Please bring documentation into the health office as soon as the immunizations are received or fax records to (480) 224-9137.
