Course Description

The eighth-grade social studies program will investigate the ideals of citizenship and civic engagement through a civics and economics lens in the inquiry process. Students will examine connections between historical and current/recent issues as a base for implementing societal change. Students will recognize and practice their roles and responsibilities as American and global citizens. United States history will focus on the significant events rooted in the Constitution, Bill of Rights, and subsequent amendments.

Student Handbook

Student Responsibilities

Academic Integrity/Cheating:

Cheating of any kind (yes, plagiarism is cheating) will not be tolerated. Copying another person's work, allowing another student to copy your work, or turning it in as your own work that was done by another person all constitute cheating.

Statement Concerning Plagiarism:

Plagiarism is defined as representing the work of another as one's own. More than four consecutive words from a source other than the writer constitute plagiarism when the source is not clearly identified appropriate documentation.

Technology:

With the 1:1 technology initiative, it is the responsibility of the student to bring their fully charged laptop to school every day. Technology is a tool no different than a pencil. Like all school supplies, students are expected to have the supplies needed to learn.

Discipline Protocol:

It is the expectation that students hold themselves to high standards. The teacher will address students who are not meeting these expectations. Typical classroom behavior consequences these are the standard progression for discipline:

1. A warning
2. A warning with a phone call
3. A Parent-teacher conference
4. A referral.

• Our goal is to work with families to ensure that all students have a safe and focused learning environment.

Tardy Protocol:

Students are expected to be in their seats when the bell rings and ready to learn. If a student is tardy to class teachers will follow this progress to rectify students being late to class.

1. A warning on their first and second offense.
2. The teacher will email / call home.
3. Notify Attendance Interventionist and email / call home.
4. On the fifth offense, the teacher will refer the student to our Attendance Interventionist, who can work with families and assign Saturday school if necessary.

• The teacher has the option to provide their own lunch detention at their discretion instead of writing a conduct referral.

Late work

Students are responsible for planning with their teachers to complete make-up work for excused absences or suspensions. Make-up work must be completed within the same amount of time after returning as the class periods absent (for example, allow two days to complete missed work for two days of absences).

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the [District Calendar](#).

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

Quarter grades

Grading Policy:

Grades will be calculated from the student's test scores, quizzes, homework, projects, presentations, and class participation. Grades are based on cumulative points per semester and calculated into a percentage.

Letter grades are based on the following percentages:

90% - 100% = A, 80% - 89.9% = B, 70% - 79.9% = C, 60% - 69.9% = D, 59% & below = F.

Semester grades

Semester grades are calculated using 40/40/20: Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
