What is Dual Enrollment?

- Earn college credit while attending high school classes
- Taught by high school instructors who are college certified
- Class taught at college level
- Saves time and money on tuition and books
- Credits transfer to most colleges and universities
- Need-based tuition assistance available

Benefits of Dual Enrollment

- Increases retention and completion of college
- Higher GPA, higher retention (80.7% vs. 64.5%), higher completion (3.5 X) in college
- Helps prepare students for the academic rigor of college
- Helps with job placement
- Provides realistic information to high school students about the skills they need for college.
- Saves time and money by compressing the years of financial support needed to attend college
- Creates a smoother transition for students



Dual Enrollment

Dual enrollment students earn a college grade and credit while attending their high school classes. The grade the student earns for the high school course is the grade that will show on their college transcript.

AP (Advanced Placement)

Students in AP classes can receive college credit based on the score they earn on the AP exam. Colleges can vary on what score is necessary for them to accept the exam for credit.

Concurrent Enrollment

Concurrent enrollment students take classes at the community college in addition to their high school classes.

- Course Equivalency Guide
 - Explains the value of MCCCD courses to ASU, NAU, or UofA
 - Course values <u>are</u> subject to change; often without advance notice
- Exam Equivalency Guide
 - Explains the necessary score and credit available for AP, CLEP, etc.
- Major Guides
 - Explains which majors are available at the three state universities
 - Indicates levels of math
 - Indicates common courses
 - Indicates if second language is necessary



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The AGEC

- <u>A</u>rizona
- <u>G</u>eneral
- <u>E</u>ducation
- <u>C</u>urriculum
 - 35 to 38 semester credit block
 - Fulfills lower-division general education requirements
 - Transfers to AZ public universities <u>without</u> loss of credit



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Three types of AGEC

- AGEC-A, (35 crd) designed to satisfy requirements in many liberal arts majors
- AGEC-B (ABUS), (35 crd) designed to satisfy requirements in business majors
- AGEC-S, (36-38 crd) designed to satisfy requirements in majors with more rigorous mathematics and mathematics-based science requirements
