# Attendance

## In Person Attendance Policy

- A.R.S. §15-803 (B) states that absences may be considered excessive when the number of absent days exceeds ten percent of the number of required attendance days prescribed in A.R.S. §15-802. Ten percent equates to nine (9) days of absences per semester regardless of whether they are excused or unexcused. After ten (10) absences a student may be dropped from the class.
- Students with excessive excused absences will be required to provide medical documentation to remain in class and excuse any further absences. If additional absences occur, and medical documentation is not provided, the student will be referred to administration


## Academic Dishonesty

## Discipline Flowchart

- 1st Offense: Teacher proximity, verbal warning, reminder to get back on task.
- 2nd Offense: one-on-one conversation to brainstorm ways to remain focused and in control.
- 3rd Offense: loss of privileges (ie phone on teacher desk, move seats for the class period), and phone call/email home
- 4th Offense: referral, email/phone call home, permanent loss of privileges (ie seating chart change, phone to security desk), referral.
- Major Disruption: removal from class, referral, possible suspension

### **Late Work**

Due dates will be determined by the teacher.
Work is considered late unexcused if not submitted by the due date. Late work may be deducted 10% for every 24 hours it is late, up to 50%. Work more than 2 weeks late (unexcused) will not be accepted.

Plagiarism is defined as taking someone else's work (from a fellow student, an author, an internet source, or a teacher's key) and passing it off as your own. The consequences of plagiarism are as follows:

- **1st offense:** call or email home, 50% on plagiarized assignment.
- 2nd offense: call or email home, 0 on the plagiarized assignment.
- 3rd offense: call or email home, 0 on plagiarized assignment, referral to administration
- **4th offense:** call home, referral to administration, possible suspension and F in course.

## Tardy and Restroom Policy

## **Tardy Policy**

A student is considered late if they come to class more than 30 seconds after the final bell without a pass. I will contact home at 5 tardies, and will continue after every subsequent tardy. I will write a referral for excessive tardiness at 10 unexcused tardies.
