Fall 2021 Survey

- On August 30th, 2021, Superintendent Narducci and CFO Lana Berry presented to the community on the strategies and asked for their input. We received 45 responses.
- Additionally, we surveyed all CUSD staff (August 18 September 8) resulting in 691 responses.
- Using our survey results, as well as internal conversations with site administrators, teachers, parent committees, faculty committees, etc. we determined how to allocate ESSER III funds.

Spring 2022 Survey

- Superintendent Narducci met with his Parent Advisory on March 29th, 2022 and received their input regarding the ESSER III strategies resulting in 24 responses.
- We also sent a survey to all CUSD staff on April 3rd that was open until April 17th yielding 881 responses.
- District administrators also continued conversations with site administration, teachers, as well as Superintendent Narducci discussing ESSER III with his Faculty and Parent Advisories.




Spring 2022 Survey Results

Would you support CUSD continuing to use MobyMax for our students?	
Would you support CUSD continuing to use NetTutor for our students?	84.3%
Would you support CUSD continuing to use tutoring, homework club or other extended learning opportunities at our sites for our students?	
Would you support CUSD continuing to offer these Community Ed programs at our Title sites - Science Matters, Bricks 4 Kidz, or Dance Sequins?	
Would you support CUSD using ESSER III funds to increase devices for students to get to a 1 to 1 student device ratio?	90.3%
Would you support CUSD using ESSER III funds to deliver professional development to teachers?	76.6%
Would you support CUSD using ESSER III funds to create K-12 site-based data, instructional and	
academic intervention coaches?

 - Currently spent only 10% of the dollars allocated in Strategy 4
 - Considering repurposing these funds to a different strategy
- 5. Academic Outreach through Community Ed Clubs and Before and After School Programming

- 6. Professional Development (funded out of Prop 301)
- 7. Technology– student access to devices and WiFi (now being funded using capital)
- 8. Site-Based Data/Academic Coaches (still on hold)
- 9. Staffing for High Intensity Intervention Models
 - Using the funds from technology to support the needs of our 7 sites targeted with this strategy
- 10.COVID Mitigation (spent and not anticipating needing more)
