TOPIC SENTENCE:	Statement that clarifies your focus for the paragraph.
SEE SET:	Statement Evidence example Explanation of your <u>first</u> piece of evidence
SEE SET:	Statement Evidence example Explanation of your <u>second</u> piece of evidence
SEE SET:	Statement Evidence example Explanation of your <u>third p</u> iece of evidence
CLOSING SENTENCE:	Commentary that ties these SEE sets back to your topic sentence that in turn supports the thesis statement.

BASIC ESSAY STRUCTURE

ATTENTION GRABBER: BACKGROUND: THESIS:	A few sentences that introduce your reader to your topic in an interesting way Provides all the information that your reader needs in order to understand your thesis A statement that clarifies your position or purpose
