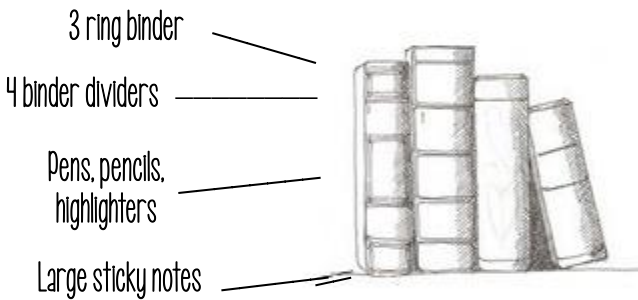

electronic devices
