What is the PSAT/NMSQT?

The PSAT/NMSQT (or National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) is a preliminary version of the SAT. The test is a prep for the college entrance exams SAT or ACT. If a great score is obtained on the PSAT/NMSQT it can also open the door to participation in the National Merit Scholarship competition and other awards.

When and how do students sign up for the test?

- Step 1 go to the CHS bookstore to pay.
- o Step 2 Sign up for REMIND (class code @ff6a32)
- Step 3 Go to www.bit.ly/PSATStInfo (case sensitive)
- Cost of PSAT/NMSQT
 - July thru August 30 =\$20 (standard test fee)
 - Sept.thru Sept 27th = \$25 (late fee added)

Why take the PSAT/NMSQT?
