What does the research say?


ACT

- Students who take one or more courses beyond core and at an honors level are more likely to meet or exceed the ACT College Readiness Benchmarks.
- This means that these students are more likely to enter college, be ready to take credit-bearing college courses, and succeed in those courses.


AP/IB and College Success[™]

Students who take AP/IB courses and exams are **much more likely** than their peers to complete a bachelor's degree *in four years or less.*

IB Program




- 9th/10th grade

Students complete IB MYP registration form in their Honors English 9 class at the beginning of the school year.



- Links CTE and IB courses
 - Prepares students to identify ethical dilemmas related to career fields, focus on thinking, intercultural understanding, communication and personal development




AVID

Earning college credit in high school

- By taking one or more DUAL ENROLLMENT courses
 Pay tuition at CCCC and earn credit while sitting in a
 - Pay tuition at CGCC and earn credit while sitting in a CHS class (mostly 10th, 11th, 12th grade)
- By taking one or more **AP exam** at the end of an AP course (10th, 11th, 12th grade)
- By taking one or more **IB assessments** as part of an IB course (11th, 12th grade)

Some CHS students start college with up to one full year of college credits

- A student may be able to enter college with 'advanced standing' earlier choice of courses, etc.
- College level work in high school may exempt a student from taking certain required college courses.
- This allows for more time in college for electives, double majors, advanced courses, study abroad, internships.
