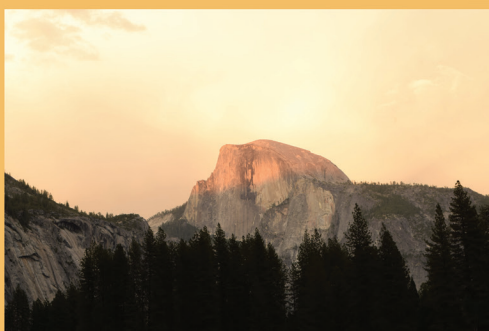

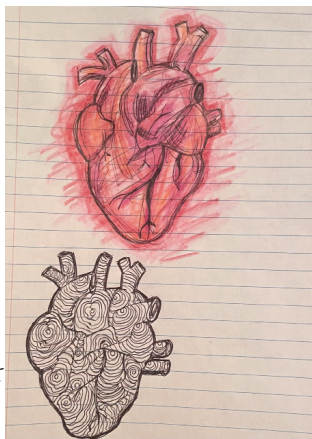
"Metamorphosis" is based off the novel by Franz Kafka. I made this art because I felt inspired after reading it for class.
