Japanese Friendship Garden, Phoenix, AZ, by Tyler Irwin

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Recent testimony by Arizona Speaker of the House Rusty Bowers suggests that former President Trump was in contact with Republican state legislators in Arizona in an attempt to overturn the 2020 election results in his favor. The continuing investigation into the assault upon the capitol on January 6, 2021, has led to a debate over the subject of whether criminal charges should be filed against President Trump and other Republican leaders. The January 6th Committee, assembled in the US House of Representatives, is charged with investigating violent extremism, Homeland Security concerns, and objections to the exercise of governmental authority that occurred at the US Capitol in early 2021. The committee includes members from both sides of the aisle led by Rep. Liz Cheney (Republican—Wyoming) and Rep. Bennie Thompson (Democrat—Mississippi)

Bowers, a Republican representing the 25th legislative district, recalls receiving multiple calls from President Trump to discuss the election results in Arizona. Bowers testified that on two separate occasions, Trump claimed to have proof of the election being rigged, citing hundreds of thousands of undocumented citizens and thousands of deceased who swayed the vote. Mr. Bowers said he asked for the evidence but never received it (NPR).

Repeating his claims of fraud, Trump had other requests for Rep. Bowers. The former president requested that Bowers hold an official committee at the Capitol to present evidence and pursue action after. The hearing never took place due to insufficient evidence.

In the wake of the hearings, Republicans opposing Trump have been praised by Democrats and scrutinized by their party. One of the Republicans in opposition was Wyoming Representative Liz Cheney. After first gaining national attention for her vote for the impeachment of former President Trump, the odds of a fourth term for the congresswoman were uncertain. Ms. Cheney trailed her opponent in the polls in her race for re-election, gaining only 30 percent of her district's support, compared to her conservative and Trump-endorsed opponent Harriet Hagemen's 52 percent. On August 17th, primary election day in Wyoming, she lost her seat, winning only 28.9% of the vote (PBS.org).

The defeat of Rep. Cheney marks the end of the Cheney family dynasty in Wyoming. Cheney grew up in a political household. Her father Dick Cheney, Vice President under President George W. Bush, is the most notable politician from the consistently Republican state. Like her father, Liz Cheney's ambition was thought to be ahead of her title; some constituents believed she was more focused on the committee than her district, saying, "She is too much Washington and not enough Wyoming," according to <u>James King</u>, a political science professor at the University of Wyoming.

After her primary loss, the congresswoman is contemplating running for the presidency in 2024, potentially following in her father's footsteps for the White House. The morning after her primary, Cheney discussed her thoughts about running and making her decision in the months to come. (CNN) A campaign for President would not be a shock to Americans. Cheney has not ruled out running for The White House in the past, and she ran national ads during her House campaign, fueling the notion in D.C. of a possible national run. Liz Cheney's political career has become directly related to President Trump's, made obvious by her opposition of his presidency, but also by her latest leadership PAC "The Great Task" formed overnight following her loss. A political action committee (PAC) is a political committee organized for the purpose of raising and spending money to elect and defeat candidates. The Great Task is a response to the possibility of a Trump 2024 campaign with the goal to "mobilize a unified effort to oppose any Donald Trump campaign for president" according to a **POLITICO** exclusive from Cheney.

With Liz Cheney's defeat, the next vice chair of the committee is uncertain. The leading republican now gone leaves the title open to whoever wants it, though most are weary after all in opposition to Trump having lost their primaries. Following the construction of the committee, traditional conservatives are being replaced by Trump-endorsed candidates all across the country, but that isn't stopping the committee.

Members of the committee discussed the possibility of releasing their reported findings in December, a month before the end of the committee on January 3rd, 2023 with the start of the new congress, but with new witnesses stepping forward and new revelations, that will most likely not happen anytime soon. Some representatives want more hearings. One person likely to be pursued for testimony will be former Vice President Mike Pence who expressed considering testifying before the committee, he announced at a New Hampshire politics event.

Celebrating 20 Years of The Japanese Friendship Garden

Russia Plans to Exit the ISS by 2024

Following the invasion of Ukraine over six months ago, there have been talks of Russia exiting the International Space Station. This is a monumental development, as Russia has been a core member of the ISS since 1998. Diplomatic relations between the United States and Russia have been strained as of late, and this announcement has made the severing of ties between the two countries imminent.

Terry Virts, a retired American astronaut who was in charge of the ISS from 2014 to 2015, thinks that there is nothing positive about this situation. Ailsa Chang of NPR reports, "he says that without the ISS, there isn't a single good thing left in U.S.-Russia relations – and after Russia's invasion of Ukraine, he sees little reason for the countries to continue working together in space." The breaking of these countries' bonds could very well result in a similar situation to the Cold War. If Russia exits the space station as promised, further interactions between the two countries are unlikely to occur.

The new chief of Russia's federal space agency, Roscosmos, was the one to initiate the departure from the ISS; as Brett Tingley of Space reports, "Roscosmos leadership has been threatening to pull out of the International Space Station for months, stating that Western sanctions will "destroy" Russian cooperation aboard the orbital lab." Sanctions imposed against Russia increased tenfold following their invasion of Ukraine, and it appears that the Russian government has finally had enough with the penalties placed on them by the US. The time frame for their departure will allow the current members of the ISS to plan accordingly.

Russia's involvement in the station, while important, won't drastically affect the function of the ISS; as Tingley reports, "the space station's design means that the U.S. and Russian segments of the station are interdependent, and it's not clear to what extent the U.S. could maintain its facilities

should Russia leave the partnership." The ISS is a symbol of the interconnectedness of all of Earth, and the loss of a major member will deeply impact this aspect of the station. Russian cosmonauts make up a staggering 20.5% of the 244 people representing 19 nations who have ever visited the ISS. For comparison, Russia has sent more cosmonauts to the space station than every nation (other than the USA) combined. The withdrawal of the Russians will represent a major turning point in the ISS's future as a collaborative laboratory.

The decades-old station is planned for retirement in only a few more years. Agence France-Presse of NDTV reported that "the year 2024 is what the partners had previously agreed to, though NASA's goal is to keep the ISS in orbit until at least 2030 and then transition to smaller commercial stations." Not everyone has quite a positive outlook on the situation, as some high ranking officials in Russia don't think that the ISS can even function without the assistance of the cosmonauts. The former chief of the space program, Dmitry Rogozin, said that "without his nation's cooperation, the ISS could plummet to Earth on US or European territory" (qtd NDTV). Russia's exit from the ISS will result in virtually no contact with America, vastly altering the political climate as a whole.

True Crime: Chopped To Pieces

In early August, José Paulino Pascual-Reyes, a 37-year-old man living in Alabama, was accused and charged with first-degree kidnapping, multiple counts of capital murder, and corpse abuse. The victims of the tragic murders were Sandra Vazquez Ceja and her son. Ceja was the 29-year-old live-in girlfriend of Reyes. They had lived together in a mobile home since February of 2022.

Ceja was smothered by her boyfriend with a pillow; her son, however, was hit and kicked to death. Both bodies were cut up into small pieces at their joints in an attempt to hide the evidence of the murders. Their chopped-up remains were found in the mobile home in which the murders occurred.

Forced to stay in that very same mobile home, was Sandra Vazquez Ceja's 12-year-old daughter, who is now safely in the custody of child welfare officials. Reyes was charged wit first-degree kidnapping of the young girl. She was not physically abducted and moved, but rather held hostage in the mobile home. <u>AP News</u> released an article written by Jay Reeves that said, "the girl was restrained to bedposts for about a week so she could be sexually abused, according to a complaint filed in court by authorities." She was continually given alcohol in order for her to remain in a "drugged state" and was assaulted in the head before her escape. According to Tallapoosa County Sheriff Jimmy Abbett and other court documents, Reyes is originally from Mexico but was staying in America illegally after being deported and returning without the proper documentation. Ceja and her two children also entered the United States from Mexico. They came in 2017 seeking asylum, their claims have not been decided by immigration officials yet.

The 12-year-old girl escaped by chewing her way out of the restraints that she had been kept in while Reyes was away. Abbett said in an interview that the young girl "is a hero for surviving the incident and coming forward with the information that she provided us in order to charge him." She was found at the side of the road and picked up by a driver who notified the authorities, prompting the investigation.

When she was found, her braces were severely damaged by her chewing through the ropes and she had marks on her wrists indicating her restraint.

According to Abbett in an article by Fox 6 News, there were "a few other people live near the mobile home and others had lived at the residence, there's no indication anyone else knew about the killings or that the girl was being held against her will." Nobody has come forward with any new information.



Dear US Government, Leave the Indigenous Community Alone.

I come from a family of Native American and German descent. My family identifies as members of the Navajo Nation. Three words that describe my family are communal, traditional, and pride. We take pride in expressing our cultural traditions while prioritizing emotional closeness and security.

Protecting our cultural traditions is important not just for my own family but for all Native American families across the United States. Throughout the twentieth century, the US federal government enacted policies intended to erase all Indigenous tribes from America. To carry this out efficiently, the US government began targeting younger generations. Citing child abuse or neglect (with little or no evidence), many private agencies removed Native children from their homes for decades, a practice that continued unchecked until the Indian Child Welfare Act (IWCA) was passed in 1978. Most often these children were placed with white adoptive and foster families, losing their cultural identity and possibly developing years of trauma. Thankfully, since 1978, the ICWA has protected the authority of tribal governments to conduct the removal and out-of-home placement of American Indian foster children.. Under this sacred principle, these children have remained under the wings of tribal nations for over forty years.

As a sister with two younger brothers, it is comforting to know that the ICWA ensures they will never be isolated from our culture if they ever enter the foster care system. However, on February 28, 2022, the US Supreme Court made a decision that could traumatize Native foster children: they decided to hear a constitutional challenge by the State of Texas and other plaintiffs against the ICWA.

Opposition to this federal policy is not new. Since January 2019, the Protect ICWA Campaign has dedicated its work to protect not only this Federal policy but also the deep-rooted rights of my fellow brothers and sisters. Unfortunately, the State of Texas and other plaintiffs took extra measures to achieve their

goal, and the Brackeen v. Haaland case worked its way up to the Supreme Court in September 2021. As of their latest decision on ICWA, the current objective of the Supreme Court is to hear this challenge whether the ICWA is constitutional.

One plaintiff that has supported overriding this federal welfare policy is based in Phoenix: the



Goldwater Institute. According to their website, the Goldwater Institute advocates for "preeminent liberty". They publicized their opposition to ICWA with a blog post published to their website in January 2020, titled, "Even Aside from Race, ICWA is Unconstitutional". The writer, Timothy Sandefur, reasons, "ICWA imposes its unjust burdens on children who fit a single genetic profile" and claims the "ICWA also overrides the authority of state executive officers in ways that more obviously violate the rule against commandeering" (goldwaterinstitute.org).

Jonathan Yellowhair is a Navajo man residing in Flagstaff, AZ with his family of three. He is a substance abuse counselor at Native Americans for Community Action (NACA) works with clients referred to the organization by the Arizona state courts, including cases involving DUIs, CPS, and domestic violence. He said, "My clients are still processing things... it created all sorts of historical trauma in their families, you know, regarding their relatives being taken." Nearly 85% of Yellowhair's clients are Indigenous, throughout fifty-six different

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tribes. He continued, "There's always been that notion with Indigenous people: 'We're taking on the burden of helping them' when we don't need you... ICWA is the minimum for what they can do for our communities or what they really should do from all the atrocities that were done."

The federal government must allow tribal governments to exercise their authority in ensuring the best interests of Indigenous children. This means US federal agencies should step back and let local

In recent months, trends have shifted away from fast fashion into a more environmentally conscious way of shopping-thrifting. The reasons behind the rise of thrifting are numerous. For one, today's society is attempting to reduce their carbon footprint by purchasing secondhand goods that would otherwise go to waste. Thrifting and secondhand shopping have become symbolic of Gen Z's aspiration to stray from the path created by previous generations, which resulted in massive clothing waste and the mistreatment of employees. In 2019, around 40 percent of Gen Z was buying second-hand clothing, compared to less than 30 percent years prior, according to a report managed by ThreadUp. Thrifting is becoming more popular as young adults looking for a way to shop for the latest trends, while also shopping sustainably. And, on the surface, thrifting is an amazing concept. But what scientists have come to realize over the years, is that trendy pieces are flooding the market, and therefore becoming more harmful to people. Madeline Moran, a senior at Chandler High, says, "People of our generation seek individuality, and thrift stores are places where you can find clothes no one ever has." As the popularity of fast fashion stores like H&M and Forever 21 grow at record rates, these companies are producing cheap clothing using toxic dyes, making the industry some of the largest polluters of clean water globally, states Good on You fashion. Kate Rogers, a Junior at Chandler High, says, "It makes people feel better about themselves because they believe they're not contributing to the fast fashion industry and helping the planet, even though they're not, they're still contributing and making the same amount of waste." Thrifting casts a perfect illusion of planet-friendly and guilt-free shopping, but when you take into account all the issues it's causing,

tribal agencies care for Native foster kids and keep them integrated within their own cultures. The US government needs to recognize that all 574 tribal nations are their own sovereign nations and that they should be allowed to endure their hardships, without interference from the federal government. More importantly, the US must end its historical cycle of cultural genocide, ensuring that my little brothers and other young Natives will not have to suffer the oppressive wrongdoings of America.

Buying second-hand items may seem better for the economy and the environment, but few people consider the effects of greenwashing. Greenwashing is when a company appears to be environmentally cautious for marketing purposes, but isn't making any sustainability decisions (Business News Daily). People gravitate towards fast fashion because it's trendy clothing sold for a cheap price. The pressure to speed up and reduce costs placed on sustainable clothing companies has been because of the rise of both thrifting and fast fashion. Thrift stores are barely staying above the constant demand for cheap, quality clothing. These expectations were placed because of the over-consumption of fast fashion and unethical companies' methods. There's been a huge increase in donations to thrift stores, which in theory, is a great thing. However, according to The New York Times, the increase in donations has led to an increase in business costs, which results in a need for more employees. Growing Up With Gun Violence

Ever since I was little, I've been aware of guns. I come from a family of hunters, so guns and, more importantly, gun safety is nothing new to me. But I was also aware of how dangerous a firearm can be, especially in the hands of someone who wants to cause harm. I was taught that guns are for protection and survival and should only ever be used when needed. But self-defense and hunting firearms are drastically different from military-grade AR weapons, designed for "quick and efficient killing" (bradyunited.com). The problem is that any random civilian over 18 can purchase a semi-automatic or automatic firearm with little to no prerequisites.

Over 1 million Americans have been killed in the last decade by gun violence, and numbers are rising faster than ever. Giffords Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence says that, in Arizona, someone dies from a gun every eight hours (giffords.org). According to the Everytown for Gun Safety Support Fund, in 2022 alone, there have been 95 incidents of gun firing on school grounds, causing 41 deaths and 79 injuries nationally, and that's just in the first two-thirds of the year (everytownresearch.org). When it comes to how often American children are exposed to gun violence, gunfire at schools is just the beginning; Everytown reports that "every year, more than 3,500 children and teens are shot and killed, and 15,000 more are shot and injured" (everytownresearch.org). Most recently, a school shooting in Uvalde, Texas, left 19 elementary-aged students and teachers dead. Even as shooting numbers rise, it feels to me like nothing is changing.

Intruder and lockdown drills are practiced in every school in the country, training kids as young as three to be ready in the event of an active shooter. We lock doors, require gates to be closed, insist on mandatory school IDs for every student, and practice for the worst-case scenario instead of addressing the problem of guns being far too easy to get. Teachers are expected to defend their kids, even if it means using themselves as a human shield. According to Everytown, 17 states currently allow teachers or school staff to be armed in the classroom under varying conditions as a further precaution and protective measure in the event of a shooter. Instead of getting to the root of the problem and increasing the criteria needed to get a gun, the government would rather avoid the heart of the problem, placing band-aids over literal bullet wounds.

Guns are far too easy to get in America. According to Cassidy Johncox, "Many states have added restrictions and regulations that may require additional background checks or waiting periods. But, for the most part, Americans can typically purchase a gun within hours" (clickondetroit.com). In addition, under federal law, Americans are not required to undergo a background check when purchasing a firearm from a private seller. This means that in many states, anyone over 18 can quickly obtain a gun within the day. While laws differ between states, Arizona has some of the laxest gun laws in the country. For example, Arizona does not require gun owners to have a permit, undergo a background check, or register a gun purchased from a private individual. Strengthening gun control laws on the federal level would limit the number of people who can get guns and prevent certain types of guns like AR-15 rifles and other assault weapons from being accessible to civilians.

The threat of gun violence has become a part of nearly every student's life, yet we still do nothing to stop it. Instead, we allow our youth to live in fear every day, saying that the problem isn't the weapon but the person behind it. While there may be truth to that, it doesn't negate the blame on our government who allowed that person to get a gun anyway. School shooters, lockdowns, and gun violence are not things children should have to worry about. It is not fair for the priorities of our government to lie not in the education of its youth but in upholding the Second Amendment, an outdated law written hundreds of years ago. I am tired of planning places to hide in every classroom, of jumping at every loud noise from the hall, and I am tired of pretending that my life and the lives of millions of other students around the country are less valuable than someone else's ability to buy a gun.

Low-Income Students Go Hungry

As many families across the country prepare for the start of a new school year, changes are bound to happen-including the conclusion of free school lunches for every student at public schools. For the first time since the 2019-2020 school year, students will have to pay for their school lunches. The federal waivers granting free lunches have provided millions of kids across the country with meals both in and out of school. If this program was beneficial to every kid, it begs the question-why are free lunches ending? Having free and reduced lunches are extremely helpful to many families. Before March 2020, children in families whose incomes were at or below 130% of the federal poverty level were eligible for free school meals, while those in families whose incomes were 130% to 185% of the poverty level were eligible for reduced-price meals. (NBC News). School lunch is critical to student health and well-being, especially for low income people. This guarantees that students have the nutrition they need throughout the day to learn and be engaged in school. Research shows that having free or reduced priced lunches reduce food insecurity, obesity rates, and poor health. (FRAC). The National School Lunch program is the second largest food and assistance program that makes it possible for every child to have lunch everyday. The Food Research and Action program states that approximately 95% of schools participate in the program, serving close to 30 million kids a day.

The Universal School Meals program was passed last year to make sure that every child had a free lunch, regardless of income, during the pandemic. However, it was removed from school after Congress cut back on the pandemic budget. Though the program was set to expire in June 2022, days


before expiring President Biden signed the Keep Kids Fed act that funded programs through September 30th, and nutritional meals program throughout June 30, 2023. (Forbes). Last year, Data For Progress found that 44% of Americans strongly support permanently extending the Universal Free Meals program. If so many people support this, it raises many questions? Why are they stopping this program, and where do they get the funding from?

The National School Lunch Program is a federally assisted program through the United States operating in public and non-profit private schools to ensure kids get lunch. It provides nutritionally balanced, low-cost or free breakfast and lunches to children each school day. Lisa Davis, the senior Vice President of the No Kid Hungry campaign at Share Our Strength, says, "Even though this bill doesn't have everything we had hoped and dreamed, it still has a lot...The most important thing is they are providing relief to those families that are on the edge." The end of universal school meals will have a deep impact not just on parents, but on schools, too. Eating lunch should not be based on income, students should have the ability to get lunch whenever they want.

Blue Skies A Minecraft Mod Review

Minecraft has a massive modding community, with mods for just about anything a player could want. Some mods can be simple and sweet, while some add insane amounts of new content to explore. One example of a more content-filled mod is <u>Blue Skies</u>. While Blue Skies is nowhere near as popular as some other Forge mods, like Botania, it's certainly getting up there, currently having over 8 million downloads on <u>CurseForge</u>.

Blue Skies is a mod that adds two new dimensions to the game, Everbright and Everdawn. Accessing these dimensions is nowhere near as easy as accessing The Nether in vanilla Minecraft, where the portal within materials are accessible the starting dimension. ("Vanilla" is often used by modders describe a version of game featuring little to no modding.) Rather, the only way for a player to access Everbright or Everdawn is to find Gatekeepers: villager-like NPCs that can trade the player a journal and a specific lighter. On the top floor of a Gatekeeper's house, will be one of two portals, which can be activated using the lighter the player can trade the Gatekeeper to get. Once a player gets into either of those dimensions, the real fun of the mod begins.

After getting into just one of the two new dimensions, a player is presented with tons of new content to explore. I would even venture to say that *Screenshot of Everdawn, in Minecraft*

the content provided in just one of these dimensions alone is more than the content found in The Nether and The End combined, the other two dimensions in vanilla Minecraft. Each dimension has unique themes, resources, biomes, mobs, and even dungeons that hold their own bosses. Once in one of the dimensions, a player can find a Mason villager, who they can trade with to receive portal blocks for the other dimension. So players are not limited to the first dimension corresponding to the portal they found in the Gatekeeper's house.

Players should note that this mod does force the player to explore and provides some additional difficulty, even when entering a dimension late into a play-through. Vanilla tools and armor aren't that effective in either of the mod's dimensions, meaning that even Netherite items (the strongest vanilla gear) will be near useless in Everbright and Everdawn. A player has to start from square one after entering a dimension. Additionally, light sources don't prevent hostile creatures from spawning in Everbright and Everdawn, unlike in the three dimensions present in vanilla Minecraft.

Overall, Blue Skies is an incredible mod for Java players craving new content, bosses, and a bit of added difficulty. What I have discussed here isn't even all of the content that Blue Skies contains. In fact, this article hardly even scratches the surface. I highly recommend checking the mod out for yourself.

With music streaming becoming more accessible to everyone, the amount of new artists posting music has skyrocketed in recent years. Despite this seeming positive, this also leads to a new, unexpected problem: too much choice. Although manv blossoming artists undoubtedly are worth listening to, for every one interesting new artist there's ten who bring very little to the table. This is where Pigeons & Planes comes in. A side project of *Complex* magazine, Pigeons & Planes works to bring underground artists into the spotlight through their website and numerous social media accounts. They've been posting underground songs, albums, and artists for years, but in 2022 they announced something different: an album.

First announced in November of 2021, the collaboration album of underground artists showed a lot of potential. However, the biggest surprise was yet to come: Mike Dean, an all-time legend in the hip hop world known for his work with icons like Kanye West, would be both producing and executive producing the album. On top of the business side, the roster of artists was also filled to the brim with talent. Recognizable names included Teezo Touchdown, who gained notoriety for his features on Tyler, the Creator's most recent album, along with redveil and Ben Reilly, who both became TikTok sensations in the past year.

Despite the hype surrounding it online, an important question remained when the album dropped on August 5th: is the album good? In short, yes. Mostly. The album serves its purpose perfectly, with 14 young artists getting their time to shine. Although some of the tracks blend together, on some tracks you can tell that the artist truly was given full creative control, and no song demonstrates this as well as "Loner", featuring Terry Presume. Terry's lyrical style and unique voice are on full display,

coming together to make a song that fits perfectly into his discography. Other standout tracks include "Mean Girl" featuring Wallice, and "Gum" featuring Baird. Both of these were by artists I hadn't even heard of before, and they both motivated me to check out the rest of their catalog.

Although some tracks stand out, the whole tracklist is filled with strong entries. Mike Dean's influence is heard throughout, with his signature synth and guitar solos being sure to please any fan of his other work. However, this does cause one of the major problems with the album: because of the distinct production, many of the songs start to sound the same. This is most notable between "Float" feat. redveil and "Dimes" feat. Ben Reilly, which sound almost the same. On top of this, although the spacey synths in the beats work for some artists, they definitely don't for others. On "OZ" feat. Sash, his voice disappears almost completely into the beat. Despite these problems, none of the songs are bad by any means.

Even though the production of this album leaves some things to be desired, overall the project does its job, and makes me excited for future entries in the Pigeons & Planes catalog.


