Rep. Mike Johnson assumes US House leadership amid shutdown

After 22 days of stalemate, the House of Representatives elected Mike Johnson (R-La) as speaker. Johnson has been serving his fourth term since 2017, representing Louisiana’s 4th congressional district. He has made history as the first speaker from Louisiana and the first from the South since Newt Gingrich in the 1990s. Previously unknown by a majority of Americans and other congressmen, the new speaker has already begun making an impression after winning by secret ballot.

Mike Johnson’s positions are notably conservative, particularly when it comes to contentious issues such as abortion, same-sex marriage, and LGBTQ+ rights. His past affiliation as a lawyer with the Alliance Defending Freedom, a group that opposes privacy rights, abortion, and contraception, has made headlines recently. The ADF is credited with legal arguments in the case of 303 Creative v Elenis, which resulted in a Supreme Court ruling that allowed a wedding website designer to decline service to same-sex couples. In 2020, Johnson led a Texas lawsuit against President Biden’s win in four battleground states; Pennsylvania, Georgia, Wisconsin, and Michigan. Though the lawsuit never gained any momentum, it gained Johnson President Trump’s attention.

Speaker Johnson’s first

Arizona's water problem could leave state dry by next century

Arizona is currently facing a difficult issue concerning one of our most vital resources: water. It started in 2015 when the Saudi-Arabian company, Fandomonte Arizona, purchased about 3,500 acres of land in the Butler Valley just west of Phoenix to grow alfalfa used to feed cows all the way in Saudi Arabia. But in order to cultivate this water-intensive crop which requires a water supply of about 10 gallons per minute for every acre, they pump unlimited amounts of groundwater from an area marked as a possible future source of water for Phoenix and other metro areas. So on Tues-

day, October 3rd, Arizona Governor Katie Hobbs decided to terminate one of Fandomonte's land leases and is not planning on renewing three other leases when they expire in February 2024.

"The decision of the prior administration to allow foreign corporations to... pump unlimited amounts of groundwater to export alfalfa is scandalous," said Democratic Attorney General Kris Mayes. The results of a study conducted by Katie Hobbs' administration revealed that Fandomonte's water consumption "is equivalent to that of a city of more than 50,000 people" (The

Washington Post). And due to scarce rainfall, water pumped from the basin is essentially mined, with no replacement. Not to mention that groundwater in parts of the Phoenix area has actually been predicted to be insufficient to meet projected demand over the next century.

"With the amount of water shortage we are already facing with the Colorado River, I think that kind of exploitation here is not right," said CHS Environmental Club teacher Simone Richert, "water... should be going to the people who actually live in Arizona."

full week featured a bill providing \$14.3 billion in aid to Israel after Ukraine and Israel requested aid; however, President Biden vowed to veto the bill should it reach his desk. Prior to assuming the role of Speaker, Johnson had voted against Ukraine aid packages alongside his conservative House colleagues. However, in a meeting with senators, Johnson reassured them of his ability to provide aid to Ukraine, specifically highlighting a pairing of aid and border security policies.

Johnson must avoid a government shutdown. This week, the House approved two appropriations bills that provide funding to the legislative branch, the Department of the Interior, the Department of the Environment, and other necessary agencies. Both bills were

overwhelmingly approved across party lines, paving the way for a spending battle with the Democratic-led Senate before the deadline of November 17.

Two weeks before federal funding expires, the House has passed seven appropriations bills overall, surpassing the halfway point toward passing all 12 of its annual spending legislation. The House has yet to announce a plan for preventing a government shutdown, despite Johnson's announcement that he intends to move forward with some sort of temporary funding bill to give legislators more time for discussions with the Senate on its appropriations bills. Johnson has stated that he would prefer a quick fix that would last until mid-January, but it is unknown what that plan would look like.

Taylor Swift's "Eras Tour" film hits theaters nationwide

The new Taylor Swift Eras Tour has recently blown up around the world, surpassing \$100 million at the global box office in Presales alone. Not only that but advance ticket sales in the U.S. surpassed \$37 million in the first 24 hours for AMC and Cinemark. This broke AMC's U.S. ticket sales record, the previous highest-ticket sales revenue being \$26 million.

Through a special distribution deal, about 57% of the box office goes to Swift and AMC's distribution fee, with the other 43% going to theaters' coffers. This is beneficial for Swift, already knowing she made more than \$1 billion in gross profits from the Eras Tour itself.

AMC also had benefits from its deal too, with its theaters accounting for 40.5% of the domestic total when the market share is

typically 22% to 25%. Theaters will also make more in concession sales, promoting collectible popcorn tubs for \$14.99 and cups for \$11.99.

The tickets for the Eras Tour were priced at \$49 to \$450, with VIP packages

starting at \$199 and reaching \$899, though at the secondary market many of the tickets sold for thousands of dollars each. Thankfully for fans, tickets for her filmed concert start at \$19.89 for adults and \$13.13 for kids.

They also have a pumpkin patch and a 20-acre corn maze, the biggest corn maze in Arizona! Additionally, you can enjoy delicious treats such as the sweet and tart caramel apples or apple cider donuts made from freshly picked apples.

You can also have a beautiful and relaxing experience at Carefree Desert Gardens in Carefree, Arizona. It is a 4-acre, city-owned garden where you can admire the desert flora. It is free to visit and there is

even a farmers market on Friday mornings. But if you are looking for something more thrilling, a kayak trip in the Emerald Cave in Willow Beach would be a good idea. The walls lining the cave are 5,000 to 7,000 feet high and the water is a green tint due to a mixture of the cave walls’ sunlight, algae, and brown tints. Are this season’s fall drinks a ‘gourd’ time, or do they ‘fall’ short?

As October creeps up on us, the temperature falls and Halloween-themed decor populates the storefronts. The real indicator of fall, however, is not the changing hue of leaves or Spirit Halloween: it’s Pumpkin Spice. While the pumpkin spice drink genre has been largely associated with Starbucks since any of us can remember, a multitude of fast food places have attempted to replicate this popular drink, with varying levels of success.

While the rest of the reviews in this will be variations of the PSL, I had to try Wendy’s slightly more innovative approach to the autumnal addition: The Pumpkin Spice Frosty. I was slightly apprehensive coming into this, as the sickly orange color doesn’t exactly inspire confidence, but I was blown away.

There are undeniable notes of nutmeg, cinnamon, and ginger, and the combination of these spices is incredibly reminiscent of apple pie. It’s safe to say that this take on a fall treat was executed incredibly well, and I was more than willing to finish the entire thing. Is it the same format as the Pumpkin Spice Lattes we

all love? Not hardly, but is it worth a try? Absolutely!

Onto a more traditional example of a fall drink: McDonald’s Pumpkin Spice Latte. The franchise as a whole gets a bad rap in my opinion, and some of their food can be quite good. That being said, I can’t extend that compliment to their Pumpkin Latte.

The cloyingly sweet pumpkin mixture left an imprint on my taste buds that I wasn’t soon to forget. Dense syrup gathered on the bottom of the cup, and it took vigorous stirring to reincorporate the ingredients back into one mediocre concoction. If I was too subtle, let me say that I do not like this drink. I could tell you any flavor in the world, and the jumbled flavor profile of this drink would match it. No aspect of it even resembles fall, let alone pumpkin, and it’s a huge step in the wrong direction for this fast-food conglomerate.

The final, and sweetest, entry into this fall drinks foray is Dutch Bros’ Caramel Pumpkin Brulee Freeze. I got the chance to interview one of the baristas, and she commented, “The Caramel Pumpkin

Brulee Freeze is probably our most popular fall drink right now,” and I can see why. The crunch of the raw sugar pieces combined with the nuttiness of the pumpkin drizzle creates my absolute favorite drink on my list. There is one major drawback with this treat, however: the sugar content is staggering. Over 135 grams of sugar are packed into a large version of the freeze, far exceeding the daily recommended amount of sugar. It’s clear why the drink is so delicious with numbers like these, but just keep it in mind before you go digging into a 32 oz.

Did any of these treats match the well-deserved hype surrounding Starbucks’ Pumpkin Spice Latte? I would gladly try the Frosty and the Freeze again and again, and I honestly think they put up an incredible fight against the powerhouse PSL. McDonald’s rendition, on the other hand, is a nauseating excuse for a drink that has far too much flavor and far too little direction. At the end of the day, all of these drinks are fall-themed, but I can only recommend Wendy’s and Dutch Bros as suitable competitors to Starbucks.

Foods I'm thankful for

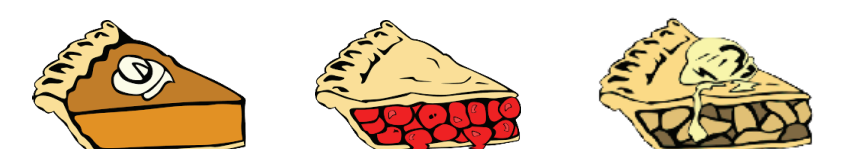

Mortal Kombat's newest release breathes new life into the series

Fighting games are some of the oldest video games to date, and arguably the most recognizable. NetherRealm's *Mortal Kombat* was the first franchise to come out in 1992, with Capcom's *Street Fighter* being released to directly compete with it just two years later.

Now, *Mortal Kombat 1*, the twelfth game in the series, has been released for PC and all major consoles. This latest installment sees a lot of triumph for the series as a whole. That includes getting Jean Claude Van Damme, whose movies inspired the creation of *Mortal Kombat*, to be included in the game as well as including beloved pop culture icons as playable characters—like *Alien* or *Predator* from their respective movies, who were featured in past games. *Mortal Kombat 1* also features a brand new story, new environments, and an entirely revisited fighting system. Overall, it looks like this iteration in the series is top-of-the-line, surpassing every version before it.

Mortal Kombat, as a series, has a reputation for threading the needle of playing off itself and doing something completely new. *Mortal Kombat 1* is no different, instead taken further. With the fact that *Mortal Kombat 11* finished off a trilogy in the series, *Mortal Kombat 1* acts as a soft reset. Characters are given new context and

backstories, some even in different roles than before, and the universe's lore is remade nearly from scratch. There's an in-universe reason for this, but in reality, NetherRealm most likely wanted a new direction for the game series. This is for the better, considering the very little amount of material they had after *Mortal Kombat 11*. With a new perspective on the world of *Mortal Kombat*, the developers were able to deliver a breath of fresh air for the fans.

The new takes on the realms in *Mortal Kombat* certainly prove this. *Earthrealm*, of course, hasn't changed much, but *Outworld* and the *Netherrealm* were reworked from the ground up. Instead of barren wastelands and empty deserts featured in the preceding trilogy, *Mortal Kombat 1* dresses its alien realms in ethereal textures. You'll battle through lush forests and city festivals more often than you will be in a dank cave or dungeon. This not only offers a nice juxtaposition for the players, but also stands as a testament to the amount of attention paid to the little details of the game. Backgrounds are active, and people and elements are moving around and reacting to the fight going on. Characters are rendered beautifully and movement is fluid, not abandoning the

motion capture and well-made transitions of previous games.

The movement in the fights themselves hasn't lost any of the reactivity or ease of previous games either. The combo and combat systems of *Mortal Kombat 1* are quite more streamlined and toned down compared to the game just before it. As opposed to the complicated button-mashing and environmental interactions of *Mortal Kombat 11*, *Mortal Kombat 1* instead focuses more on reactive and fast-paced gameplay. Aerial combat was also overhauled, letting players keep their opponents in the air for much longer and in more creative ways. On top of this, *Mortal Kombat 1* features online combat options, allowing players to fight others all around the world.

As much as all these improvements better the game, players have seen issues in their experiences. For one, it wasn't released on all consoles at the time of release. This is fair, some platforms take more priority than others, but the biggest problem with this is the appearance of glitches between platforms. Players have noticed a significant lack of damage output, others being outright prevented from performing certain combos, and generally a lack of polish on non-AAA consoles. This surprised many, but it is

important to keep in mind that the developers are still actively updating the game!

What has yet to be explained, however, is the shocking lack of quality on the Nintendo Switch port of the game. Graphics are sub-par, at best, and the framerate is laggy and unpredictable. This naturally floored and outraged players. *Mortal Kombat 1* is just as expensive on the Switch as it is on the PS5, running a steep \$70. This price and the abysmal quality of the game have left players upset and confused. Why was this allowed to happen? It seems that the PS5 port was simply moved onto the Switch, but the Switch doesn't have the hardware or computing power to handle all of the game's material—resulting in all the problems players have seen. Thankfully, NetherRealm has been putting in the work to troubleshoot issues and improve every version of the game. The first updates have helped with problems, but it still seems like a long way to go for the Switch port.

Keeping in line with tradition for the series, *Mortal Kombat 1* will feature paid DLC characters for players to purchase. This time around, the newcomers will feature a mix of characters specific to the *Mortal Kombat* series and recent pop culture icons like previous installments. The first of the characters to release is *Omni-Man*, from

the hit series *Invincible*. Already, from the trailers that have been released, fans of both *Invincible* and *Mortal Kombat* are thrilled with the first look at DLC. *Omni-Man*'s fantastic model and movement have caused ripples of positive traction among all forms of fans. "I think it does add some novelty to it," One long-time fan stated, "I think that it helps in the marketing of it, and helps draw in people with that, while still sticking to that kind of theme." Suffice it to say, that a lot of hype has been built for the first group of DLC characters.

Mortal Kombat has been a pillar in the video gaming industry for ages. It's inspired hundreds of other games and has subverted tropes of all kinds. It's refreshing to see such a beloved in this new form. NetherRealm has made an effort to pay attention to what the fans want, while still creating something entirely new. Compared to other video game reboots, *Mortal Kombat 1* makes the case, just like the iterations before it, that old characters and stories can be brought back to life with enough care placed into them by the developers. Not every reboot has to be a cheap cash grab, and *Mortal Kombat 1* certainly proves that ten times over.

"Five Nights at Freddy's" arrives in theaters after years-long wait

It isn't a stretch to say that the *Five Nights at Freddy's* Movie is one of the most anticipated flicks in recent memory, especially seeing as the film was first announced in April 2015. What would follow this initial announcement date, however, may very well be one of the strangest strings of incidents to ever plague a movie: massive script changes, production overhauls, and crew change-ups are just a few of the issues that pushed the anticipated release back almost a decade.

For

example, since 2017, four *FNAF* games have been released, each with their own incredibly complicated story and character development.

This perfect storm of unfortunate circumstances would result in an unprecedented eight-year delay, but as of October 27, 2023, the wait is finally over. The reception was extremely mixed, however, as the movie currently has a 29% critic score compared to an 88% audience score on Rotten Tomatoes. Diehard fans enjoyed the faithful sticking to the source material, while the general public was not a fan of the lack of horror present in the film. With a 10-day total of \$40.9 million, the *Five Nights at Freddy's* film has more than doubled its \$20 million budget and finally ended the near decade-long postponement.
