- **Welcome/ approval of minutes** Sarah Felix opened the meeting and minutes from the previous meeting were approved.
- Principal's message/A+ committee- Mrs. Druck discussed the process that the school staff is going through at this time to be recognized as an A+ school of excellence. This is separate from the letter rating that all schools get from the state. This is a recognition from Arizona Educational Foundation. The last time CTA did this was in 2011. It is a lengthy application of 50 questions with detailed criteria. The process started by the staff in August and will continue thru December. Step two involves a 2-day site visit to validate the aspects of the application. This will also involve panels to meet with the team. - **Financial update** Erin Foley had the financial statement available, reflecting from the first of the school year thru the end of September. No concerns were stated at this time. There has been more spending as preparations are made for the first fundraiser next week.
