#### **Student Handbook**

#### **Student Responsibilities**

- Cell phones are placed in a phone chart at the front of the classroom IMMEDIATELY after student walks in. This is an expected behavior/procedure in my classroom. If the student chooses not to put their phone away and are later caught using it, it will be collected for the remainder of the day. If caught a second time, the phone will be collected and sent to the security office to be picked up by a parent/guardian after school.

- Daily warm-ups are to be completed within the first 5-10 minutes of class and will be checked at the end of each week for a grade.

- There is no food nor beverages allowed (ie. sports drinks, sodas, coffee etc.) allowed in the classroom. Water is the only beverage allowed.

- Cheating will result in an office referral and will receive a zero for the work that is not completed by the student. Using online translators is a form of cheating in this class; translation tools include, but are not limited to, Google Translate, translation apps, and any form of AI.

- Students are expected to check for both PAPER-based as well as ONLINE-based assignments each day. - If students are absent, they are NOT excused from completing school work; including daily warm-ups.

- Tardiness is unacceptable. Students are considered tardy if not in their seat by the time the school bell rings. There are no exceptions. If there are extenuating circumstances, please contact me.

#### Late work

Per the HHS Student Handbook: "Students are responsible for making arrangements with their teachers to complete make-up work for excused absences. The student has the number of excused absence days to make up missed work (e.g., allow two class periods to complete make-up work for two class periods of excused absences)."

# **Assessments and Assignments**

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.
