	<b>Comprehension Strategy:</b> Summarize— stop to tell important events as you read
	Writing Focus: Informative/explanatory writing—instructions

## Activities to Do Together

### Vocabulary

With your child, use the **Target Vocabulary** words to make up a story about one of your pets, or an animal in the wild, going on an adventure.

### **Undercover Safari**

Have your child pretend to be a "mystery" animal. Ask questions about the animal to see if you can guess its identity. Then switch roles and have your child ask questions to find out your mystery animal's identity.

### Animals on the Screen

Watch a television program or DVD that tells about real animals. Then have your child write a summary of the show including its most important ideas.
