➤ 2012

Due to increased demand, the district looked for alternative opportunities for Hamilton Prep

Repurpose and remodel of Erie Elementary

Transition/rename Hamilton Prep to Arizona College Preparatory - Erie and Chandler Traditional Junior High to Arizona College Preparatory - Oakland (one school, two locations)

Course structure changed - Core & Honors/AP courses were offered.

School History & Timeline

➤ 2020

October 2020 - The CUSD Governing Board voted to move ACP-Erie to the new high school location and incorporate a 2-square mile boundary (Cooper Rd. to Lindsay Rd. & Chandler Heights Rd. to Ocotillo Rd.)

- *Carlson, Ryan, & Santan Elementary*

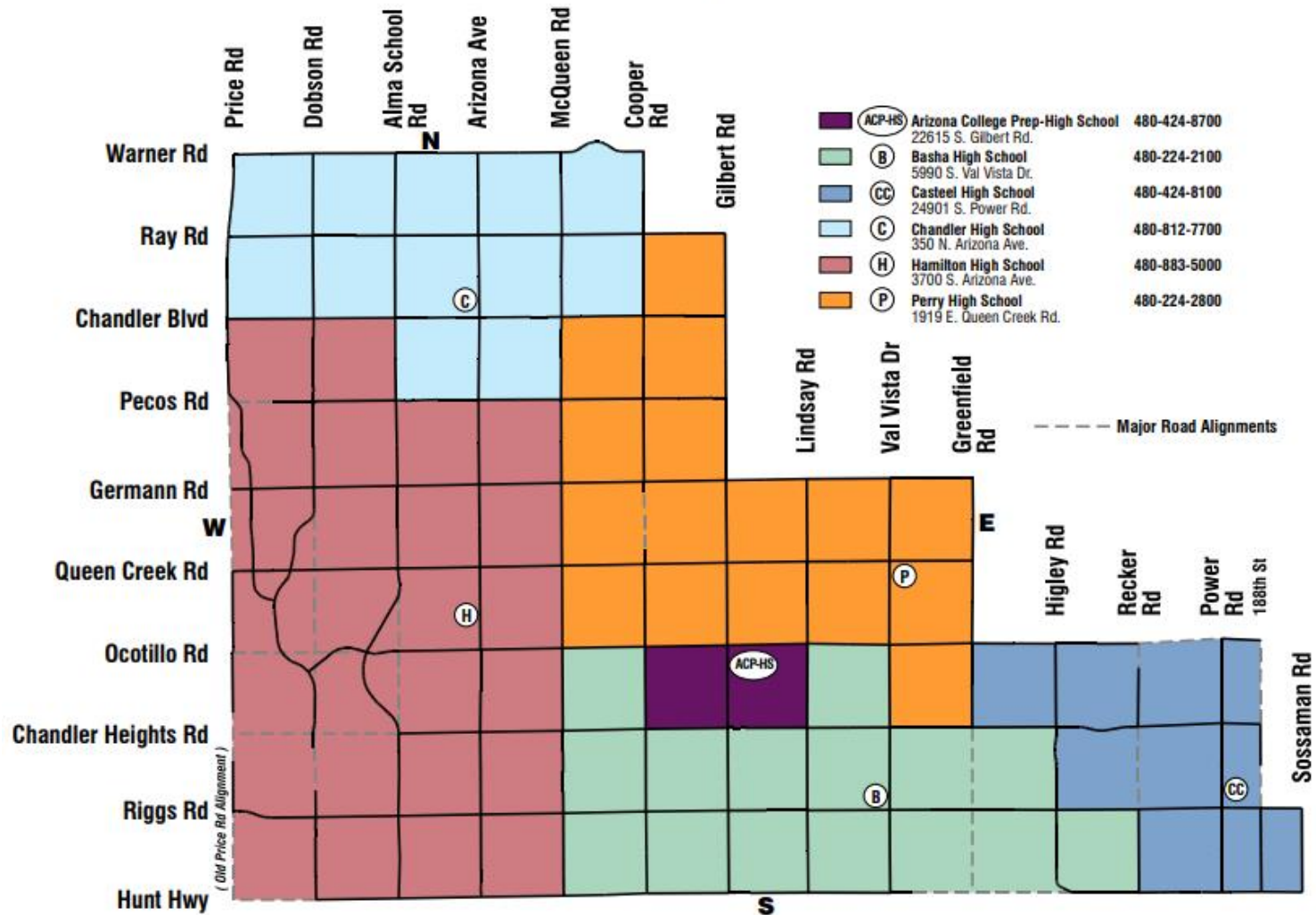
➤ 2021

General Information Student Attire

Shirts	ACP t-shirts or Polos are permitted as are shirts that promote any school-related activity (e.g., AIA State Championship, VEX Robotics, Drama, etc.), shirts that promote a college/university or branch of the military are also permitted to be worn on Friday's
Pants/Shorts/Capris/Skirts/Skorts	Approved black, khaki, purple, grey, white, denim or plaid in school colors. Pajama bottoms are not permitted.
Outerwear (sweaters/jackets/hoodies/Sweatshirts)	Outerwear must be in any combination of school colors. Outerwear promoting any military branch or college and university is also permitted and may be any color and any type.
Socks	Solid tights may be worn if they are in school colors.
Shoes	Shoes must be worn at all times. Flip flops (ones that could be worn around water), and slippers are not permitted on campus. Heels or platforms of shoes must not exceed two inches due to safety reasons.
Undershirts/Turtlenecks	Short and long-sleeved undershirts/turtlenecks in solid black, purple, gray, or white are permitted.
Headwear & Sunglasses	Hats and sunglasses are not permitted in the building (unless approved by administration).

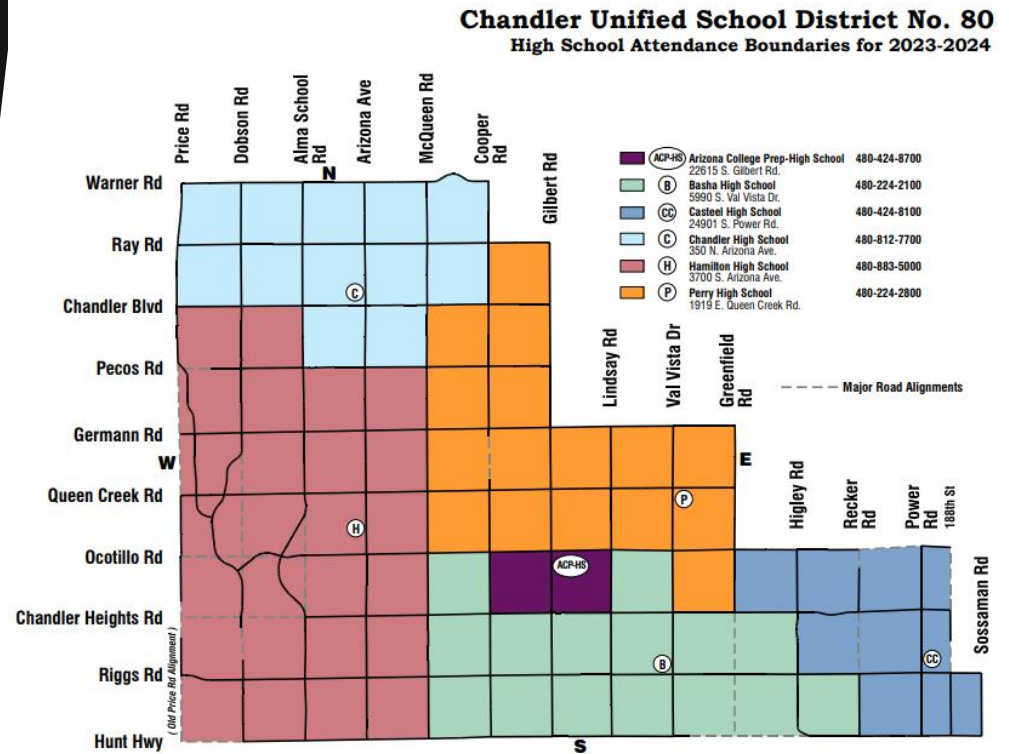

Enrollment Processes & Policies

- Enrollment - Boundary & ACPMS Families
 - Students who attend ACPMS or that reside within the boundary and currently attend a CUSD school are automatically enrolled with our school.
 - Administration and counseling will be meeting with boundary school students to begin/continue/complete the course registration process.



Enrollment Processes & Policies

- Enrollment - In ACP Boundary & Not Currently Attending a CUSD School
 - Students who live in the boundary but DO NOT currently attend a CUSD school need to complete the online registration (link on ACPHS page and CUSD page).
 - Once online registration is complete, email Ms. Bastidas, the registrar: bastidas.karina@cusd80.com
 - Registration begins Wednesday, January 8th for those families who reside within the ACPHS boundary.

Enrollment Processes & Policies

- Enrollment - Non-Boundary Families
 - Submit an Open Enrollment Application (link found on ACPHS website - “Enroll With Us” tab)
 - Open enrollment began Tuesday, November 12th
 - If not currently enrolled in CUSD, upload the following documents with your application:
 - Most current grades
 - Attendance
 - Discipline (if none, a letter indicating such)
 - 504/IEP (if applicable)
 - Open enrollment decisions are made by district office
 - turnaround time is 6-8 weeks
 - Informed via U.S. mail

Enrollment Processes & Policies

➤ Math Placement Assessment

- Taking of the placement assessment is not required & no studying/preparation is necessary
- Administration encourages families to consider this opportunity to help open lines of communication and begin academic conversations.
- Provides an opportunity for students to practice taking an academic placement exam, for example SAT, ACT or certification exams.
- Administration sets up scheduled times for all students coming to ACPHS from a non CUSD school to take a math placement exam
- Information for students enrolling from a CUSD school who wish to take a math placement exam, will receive additional information 2nd semester (2 Saturdays in the Mont of April)

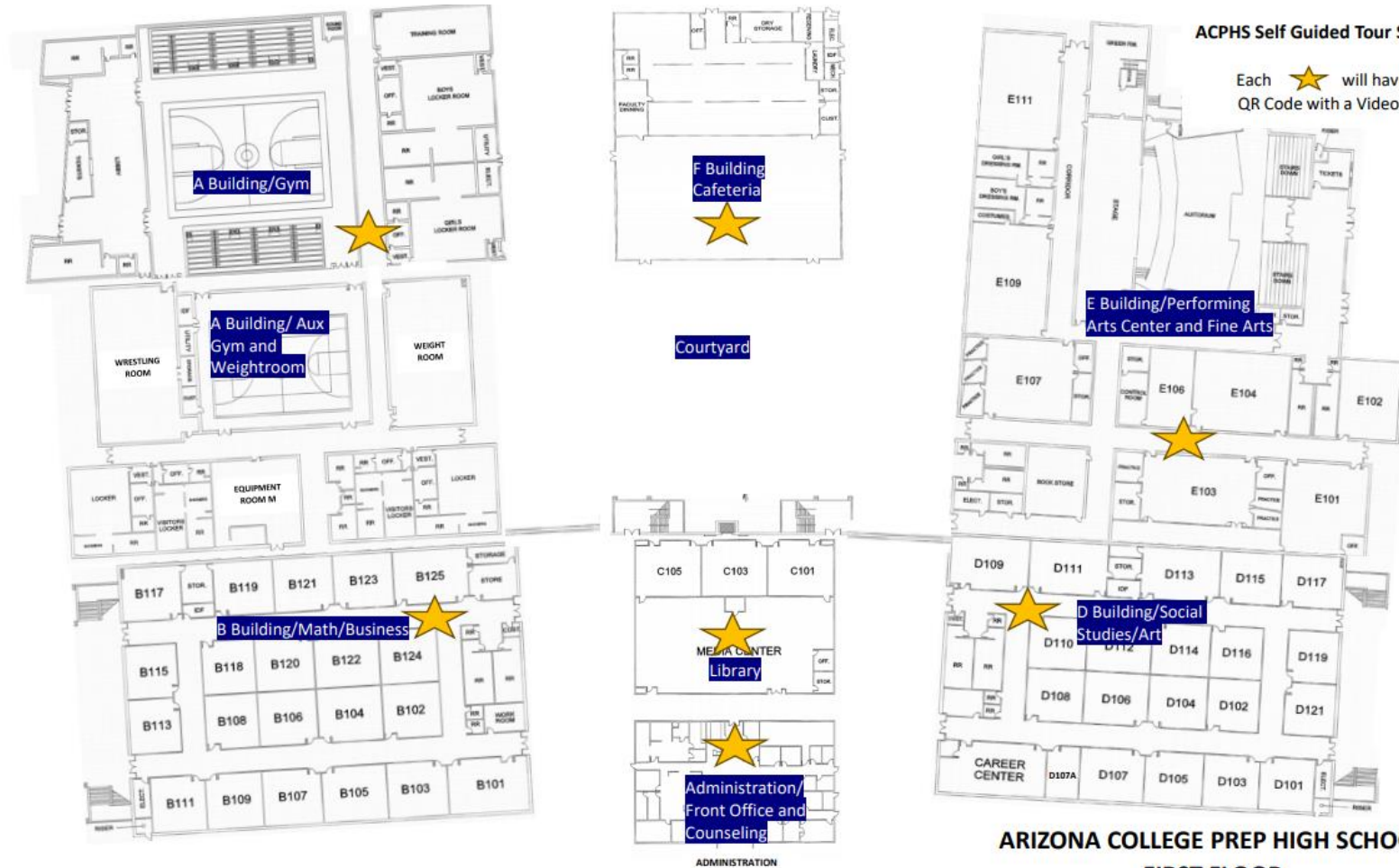
