








#### **CHANDLER ACADEMICALLY TALENTED STUDENTS (CATS)**

#### (Gifted Program)

CATS testing for students who are currently in grades 3rd through 6th will be conducted on site for placement in the gifted program for the 2018-19 school year. The test will be administered in January. CATS Testing will be taken online. Teachers or parents may request testing for any 3rd through 6th grade student. CATS testing applications can be found in the front office. Please return the forms no later than December 19th to your child's teacher or the front office. CTA Liberty will also be administering CATS testing for ALL 2nd grade students in January. The assessment will be administered on the computer so that we can receive testing information quicker. If parents do not wish their child to be tested, a signed note declining testing must be on file at the school to excuse a child from testing. We ask that parents try to refrain from picking up their child early and/or dropping them off late on these days due to testing.


