Photos in blue boxes meet dress code.



I. Shirts must be tucked in.



Uniform shirts must be tucked in.
Shirts that can't be tucked in aren't a part of dress code
(beware of shirts sewn to a skirt or shorts).



2. Shorts and skirts should be at a modest length.



Skirt and shorts should be at modest length, approximately at the knee in navy blue, khaki, or blue denim.



3. Shirts must be a collared solid red, white, or navy blue polo.



Uniform shirts must have a collar and be solid.

Jumpers without collars must be worn with a collared polo shirt underneath.



4. Jeans must be plain, dark blue denim.











5. Leggings can be worn under shorts or skirts, but not as pants.



Red, white, or navy blue leggings can be worn under skirts and shorts. Leggings are not acceptable as pants.



6. Friday spirit wear can include a school shirt or a Patriotic shirt.



Patriotic shirts must be a solid color background (red, white, or navy blue) and have a Patriotic design. These shirts do not need a collar.



7. Red, white, or navy blue long sleeved shirts can be worn underneath collared shirts.



During the colder months, students can wear a red, white, or navy blue long sleeved shirt underneath a collared shirt. Collar shirt and undershirt don't have to be the same color. Both shirts should be tucked in.



8. Sweaters and jackets to be worn inside the classroom must be red, white, or navy blue.



Sweaters and jackets
can have a small logo,
but must be predominately
red, white, or navy blue
to be worn inside the
classroom. Outerwear of any
color can be worn outside.
