GRADING

Grades will be regularly posted and managed on Infinite Campus.

Quarter grade calculation:

Social studies grades are divided into three categories: quizzes, tests, and graded assignments. <u>Semester grade calculation:</u>

Each quarter grade in a semester accounts for 40% of the semester grade, and the semester final is the remaining 20% of the semester grade.

Grading Scale: A = 90-100% B=80-89% C = 70-79% D = 60-69% F = 0-59

GRADED ASSIGNMENTS

- Homework is due at the beginning of class.
- Work emailed to the teacher will not be accepted.
- Written work must be completed legibly, in pencil or dark blue/black pen, and on a full page of lined binder paper; otherwise, work must be redone, with a 20% deduction. Typed work must follow MLA format (10% deduction). Work will only be accepted according to each assignment's instructions (such as written, typed, or online turnitin.com submission).
- Work that is turned in without a name receives a 20% deduction, and will not be graded unless the student identifies the work as their own.

• Late work is due by the beginning of the next class for a 20% deduction. No late work will be accepted later than that.

TECHNOLOGY

- Assignments that are required to be typed or submitted online will be assigned several days before the due date. Students must use technology resources in a timely manner.
- Any technology problems (printer, internet) are not excuses for late/missing grades.
- Students must plan ahead to use resources accordingly, and if errors do come up, to find other resources to ensure that the assignment is still submitted correctly.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

- When absent, students should refer to infinite campus and the class web page.
- Upon return, it is the **student's responsibility** to refer to class calendar to write down work missed, collect resources, and speak to the teacher regarding make up work/quizzes/tests.
- Work will only be sent home after three days out due to illness/emergency.
- Work will not be given to a student prior to the absence.
- For each day absent, a student will be given a day to make up the work. Within this time frame, a student must make arrangements for any missed quizzes/tests, or **that grade will remain a zero**.

BEHAVIOR

- Respect to the teachers/staff, other students, and school property is the most valuable expectation.
- Following school expectations such as dress code and cell phone/technology policy is a sign of respect; repeated infractions are considered defiance.
- Behavior issue=in class behavior form; 2 behavior forms=lunch detention. Repeated lunch detentions or more serious behaviors will result in a referral.
- Quizzes/tests: Any communication/interaction or technology during a testing session will result in a consequence, ranging from detention to **a zero score**, even if student has finished their test.
- Students caught cheating will receive an **automatic zero** and possible office referral.

We all have the same goal: success for the student. These rules and procedures will be followed consistently to help students succeed, which includes learning from any struggles they may have. A more thorough handout on class expectations will be given to and reviewed with students, which they should refer to throughout the year. A clear, respectful line of communication is the best way to ensure we have a shared understanding a student's progress.
