Students will be exploring topics of their own choosing so they will be gathering newspapers, articles, trade books, text books, websites, functional texts, and various multi-media.

Description:

6th Grade 21st Century Communications class will prepare students to critically analysis, synthesize, and evaluate all forms of communication. Students will learn how to read website content, trade books, and text books for facts that support their arguments and ideas. They will examine the differences between opinion and fact in research to determine which pieces of information are best needed to implement their ideas. They will research a wide variety of 6th Grade content topics and engage in a range of collaborative discussions.

Goals:

- 1. Students will write in a variety of formats for diverse audiences and purposes such as research assignments, informational writing, and functional writing.
- 2. Students will create presentations that include multimedia components.
- 3. Students will engage in speaking opportunities. They will present formal speeches, and they will participate in Socratic seminars.
- 4. Students will practice using the MLA (Modern Language Association) formatting and style. They will learn how to paraphrase, summarize, and quote their sources to avoid plagiarism.
- 5. Students will learn how to take Cornell Notes, organize their binders for academic success, and use Thinking Maps to deepen their understanding of material explored.
- 6. Students will meet and/or exceed AZ Merit State Standards.

Infinite Campus:

Students write their homework assignments in their agenda daily.
