# Accuplacer Exam



Dual Enrollment - The Accuplacer Exam will be given the week of **August 5**<sup>th</sup> at Hamilton. All CGCC courses require some form of placement testing including electives and foreign language. Testing is provided on specific dates at Hamilton and year-round at CGCC-Coyote Center. For more information go to www.cgc.edu/testing. Testing is free of charge.

NEW for 2019-2020—Juniors and Seniors may use their unweighted high school GPA for English and Math class placement and or take the placement tests. For all other course requirements see your high school class list for details.

# PSAT/NMSQT

PSAT/NMSQT will be held **Saturday, October 19<sup>th</sup>.** Registration. Will begin early August. The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test is a great tool for students considering college. The PSAT/NMSQT measures critical reading skills, math problem-solving skills and writing skills. We recommend that students take the PSAT/NMSQT in order to receive feedback about strengths and weaknesses, enter the competition for National Merit Scholar scholarships (11th graders) and to help prepare for the SAT.

# **Hamilton Public Library**

## Free and Reduced Priced Lunch

**Free or Reduced Lunch** is available to students in households where the income falls between the federal income limit guidelines.

# **Parking**

# Late Bus Service

Our late bus service leaves Hamilton between 3:30pm and 4:00pm Monday thru Friday. Unfortunately this service is limited and does not stop at every bus stop. Your child's arrival time will vary depending on the number of students needing to be dropped off.

# **Make Online Payments**

Parents can pay student fees online. Log into Infinite Campus through the parent portal; at the bottom left corner is a link entitled "In Touch HS Fee Payments". When you click on this link, you will be directed to the In Touch web page where you can select your student (siblings will also be listed on this page regardless of the school they attend) and pay class fees, extracurricular activity fees, sports and club class fees, for any of your student's. A \$2.00 "convenience fee" will be charged for each transaction.

## **Uniform Fees**

**P.E. Uniforms**—students are required to wear gray t-shirts and maroon shorts. If purchased at the bookstore the cost is \$15.00.

**Sports Academy Uniforms**– students in sports academy are required to wear uniforms. If purchased at the bookstore the cost is \$21.50 for shirts and \$21.50 for shorts.

**Textbooks** are provided for student use; however, if lost or damaged, the student and parent/guardian are responsible for replacement costs.

# Family Yearly Athletic Passes

Family Yearly Athletic Passes can be purchased during Husky Days for \$125.00. This pass enables families of 4 (2 adults and 2 school age children) to attend athletic home regular season games at no additional charge. *Passes cannot be used during AIA State games*.

# Student ID/Activity Cards

Get your student ID picture taken during Husky Days! Students are required to carry their student ID's at all times, even when riding school buses.

Student Activity Cards can be purchased during Husky Days for \$35.00. With a Student Activity Card you get a class t-shirt, FREE admission to all home athletic activities (except for state play-off games) for the year, and reduced rates for special events such as Welcome Back and Sadie Hawkins dances, Fine Arts productions, etc. Students can also purchase a class t-shirt for \$10.00 without an Activity Card.

# **Cum Laude Recognition Program**

We are excited and pleased to announce effective with the **Class of 2020**, that <u>all CUSD high schools</u> will be using the **Cum Laude** recognition program. This program will replace the concept of designating a valedictorian and salutatorian at graduation. Under the Cum Laude program more of our academic successful seniors will be recognized.

**Cum Laude** - meaning "with praise". To qualify a student must achieve a 3.75 - 4.24 weighted grade point average.

Magna Cum Laude - meaning "with great praise". To qualify a student must achieve a 4.25 - 4.49 weighted grade point average.

**Summa Cum Laude** - meaning "with the highest praise". To qualify a student must achieve a 4.5 - 5.0 weighted grade point average.



## Attendance

Arizona state law requires students to attend 90% of class periods in order to earn credit. Students with 10 absences or more in a semester, either excused or unexcused, may be dropped from their classes with NO credit.

## **Hamilton Dress Code**

Students must recognize that brief and revealing clothing are not appropriate apparel in school. The following guidelines are examples and do not cover all situations. Students shall NOT wear tank tops, halter-tops, garments with spaghetti straps, strapless garments, trench coats. Garments that are "seethrough," cut low, or expose one's midriff are NOT acceptable. Sleeveless garments must extend to the end of the shoulders and fit closely under the arms. Clothing should have adequate coverage to allow a full range of movement without skin or undergarments showing. Undergarments must NOT be visible. Clothing must cover the entire buttocks and extend a reasonable length to ensure modesty.

# **Health Office**



Arizona State Law requires that all **NEW** students attending public school provide verifiable documentation of immunizations. If your child is entering Hamilton High School, they will need to show proof of immunity to certain childhood diseases before he/she can start school. The minimum number of immunizations shall include the following:

- At least 4 Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis vaccines; if the last DTP was more than 5 years ago, T-DAP booster is required
- A minimum of 4 Polio vaccines
- 2 Measles, Mumps and Rubella vaccines
- 3 Hepatitis B vaccines
- 1 Meningococcal vaccine

• Students must show proof of Varicella (Chicken Pox) vaccine. Schools will accept parental recall if their child has had chicken pox and the child has moved from another Arizona area. Children from other states will need to either provide vaccination dates from a legitimate doctor's office/clinic or submit a positive blood titer. Children who have not had chicken pox will need to be vaccinated. Students who receive the Varicella vaccine beginning at 13+ years of age need 2 doses, spaced at least 4 weeks apart.

Immunizations are provided free of charge at Chandler Care Center, Chandler Regional Hospital and Maricopa County Health Dept. Letters of inadequate immunizations will be mailed throughout the school year. Parents are expected to respond in a timely manner. By state law, your child will not be allowed to attend school until either a record of the immunization(s) or an acceptable exemption statement is submitted. If you have any questions, please contact the school nurse after July 16th at 480-883-5002.

# **Emergency Cards**

Emergency cards are no longer being sent home by students for parents to fill out. Parents will now be able to fill out emergency cards online. To access go to the Parent Portal and click on Emergency and Health Update.



### **Progress Reports and Report Cards:**

Reminder....progress reports and report cards are no longer mailed. Parents can view students grades online through the parent portal in Infinite Campus. First quarter progress reports will be posted August 23rd and first quarter report cards will be posted September 27th.

#### **Dual Credit Information:**

Dual enrollment is an opportunity for eligible high school students to earn college credits during their regular high school classes. The credits students earn through dual enrollment are treated the same as regular college credits, i.e. they can be transferred to other Maricopa Community Colleges, Arizona's state universities, and even some out-of-state colleges.

Parents and students can go to www.cgc.edu/dual for more information. Registration deadline for classes is September 6th and payment deadline is September 16th.

AP changes for 2019-2020—College Board is moving testing registration to fall instead of spring. Stay tuned for more details.
