Round or square, not more than 6mm, conservative, white diamond, gold, white pearl, or silver earrings

On the crown of the head hair may protrude from the front
4. How many rings may a cadet wear in uniform?  
No more than 3
5. The Air Force philosophy is that uniform will be . . . ?  
Plain, distinctive and standardized
6. What is a gig line?  
A line formed by the facing of the shirt the buckle edge and the fly of the pants
7. What is the maximum length for female hair?  
Not to exceed 4 inches from scalp
8. What is the proper placement of the name tag on a female service uniform?  
1 1/2 inches above or below the first exposed button centered between the arm seam and the Facing
9. What are the five elements of the Air Force dress and appearance standard?  
Neatness, cleanliness, safety, uniformity and military image
10. What is the publication that governs dress and appearance of Air Force personnel?  
AFI 36-2903
11. Describe the restrictions for nail polish in uniform?  
Nail polish will be a single color that does not distinctly contrast with the female Airman's complexion, detract from the uniform, No extreme colors some examples of extreme colors include but are not limited to, purple, gold, blue, black, bright (fire-engine) red, and fluorescent colors.  
Males are not authorized to wear
12. How is the male the flight cap worn?  
Squarely on the head, no hair protruding from the front, slight tilt to the wearer's right

When the wearer is bearing arms

Must be neatly trimmed not to extend downward beyond the lip line of the upper lip or extend sideways beyond a vertical line drawn upward from both corners of the mouth

Mess Dress and Semi Formal
23. When wearing the tie, how long can it be?  
Tip of tie must cover a portion of the belt buckle but cannot extend below the bottom of belt buckle

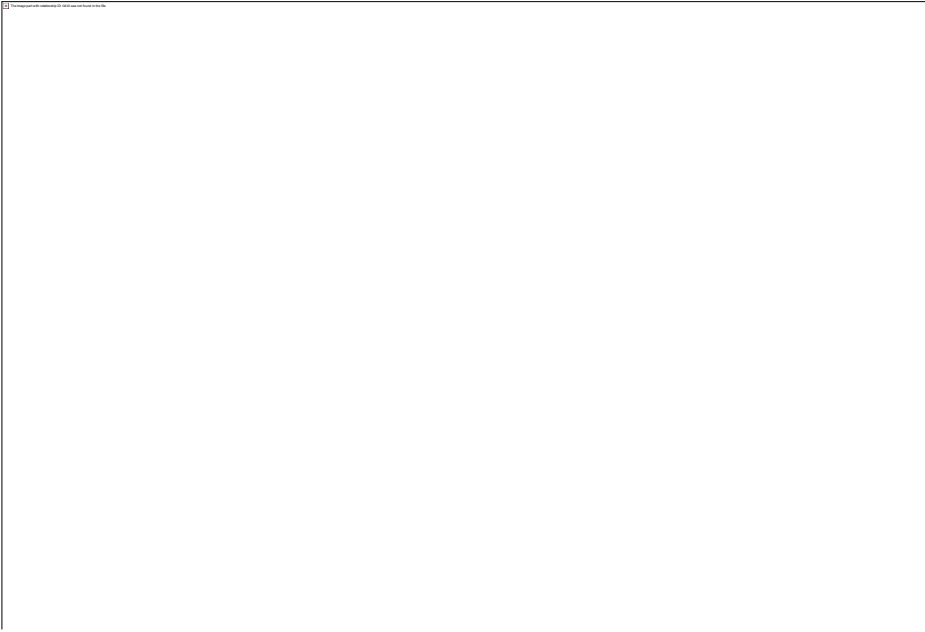

Use the following procedures to case and uncase the Colors.

a. The Color guard forms in a line formation with the cased Colors at the Carry Position (Order Position when indoors). The CG Commander then commands **Sling, ARMS**.

(1) The Color guards immediately adjust their slings and assume Sling Arms. The CG commander commands **POST**. The Color guards face to the Half Left (Right) in marching, take four steps, halt, and execute About Face.

(2) The CG commander then directs **UNCASE (CASE) THE COLORS**. The Color bearers lower the Colors (same as Present Guidon). The two guards move forward and untie and uncase the Colors. The Color bearers unfurl and immediately return the Colors to the Carry (Order) Position. While the Colors are being unfurled, the guards fold the cases and secure them in their left hand.

(3) When the Colors are in the Carry Position, the CG commander commands **Present, ARMS**. The Color guards, and the state/organizational Color salute.

(4) The CG commander commands **Order, ARMS**, and then commands **POST**. On the command of execution **POST**, the Color guards place the folded canvas cases inside the cartridge belts (center rear) of the Color bearers. The Color guards assume their original positions, adjust their slings, and return to Right Shoulder Arms.

b. To case the Colors, the procedures are basically the same except Present Arms is given before the Colors are lowered.
