Course Objectives

This course is an advanced class in Sports Medicine. It will consist of classroom and lab activities with hands-on learning. The goal of this class is to continue to develop in the students an interest and knowledge in the area of Athletic Training and Sports Medicine. Topics to be covered include Anatomy, Kinesiology, Care, Recognition, Prevention and Rehabilitation of Athletic Injuries, Injury Management and First Aid.

Grading

Your **9 week quarter grade** will be determined by dividing the total number of points scored on tests, quizzes, selected homework, class participation, professionalism points and after school field experience by the total number of points possible. Your **semester grade** will be the calculated proportionally (40% 1st or 3rd quarter, 40% 2nd or 4th quarter, 20% semester exam).

Students not turning in work on time or who are tardy for class will be assigned (ASD) After School Detention. **It is the responsibility of the student to make up missed work and to get the notes from a classmate following an absence.**

Attendance and Excessive Absences

A.R.S. §15-803 (B) states that absences may be considered excessive when the number of absent days exceeds ten percent of the number of required attendance days prescribed in A.R.S. §15-802. Ten percent equates to nine (9) days of absences per semester regardless of whether they are excused or unexcused. Students with excessive excused absences will be required to provide medical documentation to remain in class and excuse any further absences. If additional absences occur, and medical documentation is not provided, the student will be referred to administration.

This class is a hands-on learning environment. Students absent from class 6 times during a quarter will have 10% deducted off their grade. An additional 10% will be deducted for every 3 absents after the first 6. Students absent 10 times may be dropped from the class.

Test/Quiz Retakes

Students failing a test or quiz can retake it and score up to a 75% on it.

Tutoring

Available Wednesday and Thursday during Conference period.

Daily Participation Points

Students can earn up to 5 points per class period by participating in class activities.

Professionalism Expectations

- 1) Be on time (**NOT TARDY**).
- 2) Dress appropriate (School code).
- 3) Address Teacher/ Supervisor Appropriately (Mr. Michel).
- 4) Do not talk while teacher is speaking.
- 5) No cell phones, I-pods and/or electrical devices (School code).

Extra Credit Points

Students can earn up to 5 extra credit points per week. Student must be a Student Trainer and complete 10 hrs of field experience per week. Based on approval of Instructor.

Late In-class work, Homework and Test

Homework, Test or any graded in class work not turned in on time will be assessed a 10% penalty every 7 days past the due date.

Classroom Rules

1. You must be sitting in your desk working on the warm-up activity when the final bell rings.
2. No Food, Gum or Drinks in class.
3. Do **NOT** talk while the teacher is speaking or use Profanity.
4. Do **NOT** leave your desk without permission.
5. Respect the rights of others and stay on task.
6. Wait quietly in your desk until dismissed by the teacher.
7. Use electronic devices (Cell Phones) only with teacher approval.

Consequences for rule and expectation violations

- 1) Meet with student individually to address and document the violation/concern.
- 2) Call home to parent/guardian to address and document continued violation/concern.
- 3) Before school/lunch/after school detention in your class and document violation.
- 4) Meeting with parent/guardian and counselor to address violation/concern and document.
- 5) Meeting with parent/guardian, counselor and administrator to address violation/concern and document.
- 6) Referral to alpha administrator with previous steps documented.

ASD (After School Detention)

Any student that is tardy to class, does NOT have their homework completed or behaves inappropriately will be assigned ASD from 2:30 - 3:30 for the following day. Student must report to classroom (J108) for ASD. If disobedience continues, a referral to an Administrator will result.
