Course Objectives

This course is an advanced class in Sports Medicine. It will consist of classroom and lab activities with hands-on learning. The goal of this class is to continue to develop in the students an interest and knowledge in the area of Athletic Training and Sports Medicine. Topics to be covered include Anatomy, Kinesiology, Care, Recognition, Prevention and Rehabilitation of Athletic Injuries, Injury Management and First Aid.

Grading

Your <u>9 week quarter grade</u> will be determined by dividing the total number of points scored on tests, quizzes, selected homework, class participation, professionalism points and after school field experience by the total number of points possible. Your <u>semester grade</u> will be the calculated proportionally (40% 1st or 3rd quarter, 40% 2nd or 4th quarter, 20% semester exam).
