The writer identified 1 major argument debated between the delegates at the Philadelphia Convention and the resulting compromises. The writer has provided self-reflection involving evaluating the success or failure of the delegates at the Philadelphia.</p>	<p>1-F (29 or lower) The writer did not explain where and when the Constitutional Convention took place. The writer was unable to state the purpose of the Philadelphia Convention. The writer has not identified any delegates who attended or their significance. The writer provided no meaningful self-reflection involving evaluating the process of drafting the Convention.</p>
