About the Artist In Residence Program

The Artist in Residence Program is designed to immerse the entire school and community in an artistic experience through the visual or performing arts. Many times, the artistic experience involves the culture of a specific nationality. A local artist is chosen the previous year during the grant-writing process. The residency itself usually includes an introductory performance for the school by our artist. Then, our artist visits the school every day for four weeks presenting sessions to each class in the school. Usually, a core grade is chosen as a "focus" grade and receives more sessions (3rd Grade in this case). During the sessions students usually learn about the artist and their culture as well as music, dance and songs related to the culture or concept. In addition, students sometimes create art work that is displayed at the end of the residency. Finally, there is a culminating performance by our artist that includes the core grade level.

Mrs. Morgan began studying Taiko in 1992 with Esther Vandecar, founder and director of Fushicho Daiko / Phoenix Drummers as part of Esther's long term residency at Phoenix Day School for the Deaf. As the music teacher for hearing impaired and deaf students at PDS, Eileen sign language interpreted for Esther and

helped teach Taiko to the students. Eileen quickly fell under the spell of taiko and joined Fushicho Daiko as a performer and instructor in 1994. Since then, the group has traveled throughout Arizona and the Southwest, bringing high energy performances and residencies to tens of thousands of children and adults.
