SPORTS PHYSICALS ATHLEFICS

AIA regulations require that we have a current physical on file before a child may participate in sports. Physicals must be completed on AIA approved forms Please download appropriate forms from the AJHS website under the "athletics" link.

Athletic participation also requires that other clearance information be completed. These forms are also available on our school website and <u>must be completed online</u>. If you do not have access to a computer, you are welcome to come to the school where a computer will be available for you.

In order to comply with ARS 43-1089.01 and ARS 15-342(24) CUSD established an activity fee schedule for athletics and other activities. Therefore, AJHS will be collecting a fee of \$20 for any student athlete participating in school sports. Fees may be paid online through the parent portal. Please call the office if you have any questions regarding activity fees.

Although we will not be offering physicals at AJHS this year, many walk-in clinics in the area offer special pricing on athletic physicals. Feel free to check the AJHS office for flyers from clinics advertising special athletic pricing.



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IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS



ABSENCES/TARDIES

If it is necessary for a student to be absent, the school must be notified by a parent/guardian each day of the absence. A doctor's excuse is required following three consecutive days of absence. Homework may be requested after the second day of absence. Being punctual is important as tardies to school and class are monitored and may result in disciplinary action.

CHECKING STUDENTS OUT OF SCHOOL

To maintain student safety and security, a <u>parent/guardian will be required to present a picture I.D. be-</u> fore picking up a student and must be 18 years of age. Students will not be released to anyone not <u>listed on their emergency cards.</u> All CUSD junior highs are closed campuses. Students will not be allowed to leave during lunches unless a guardian signs them out of school. In case of illness, dismissal from school must be approved through the health office.

HEALTH OFFICE

Per CUSD policy, our health assistant may not give non-prescription medications such as Tylenol during the first or last class period. Medication forms and more health office information are available on our school website under the "about us" tab. Ill students must go to the health office <u>before</u> calling parents to pick them up.

DRESS CODE



Students attending Andersen Junior High School should dress appropriately for age and setting. These are young ladies and gentlemen attending school. (Sometimes they like to dress like they are going to the mall, will just be hanging out with friends or like high school students.) This is a learning environment and dress should reflect a respectful, age-appropriate attitude.

Since fashions and name designations for wearing apparel change frequently the administration, with the advice and counsel of police, faculty, students, and parents, may provide an interpretation of garments that are questionable. Please refer to the Dress and Appearance chart in the Student Handbook that will be distributed during the first week of school. The dress code is in compliance with Arizona Revised Statutes 15-712.

- Pants must not sag, expose undergarments, have holes exposing skin/undergarments, be too tight or bare. No pajama pants.
- Shirts must fit under the arms, cover both midriff and cleavage, cover from neck to shoulder Layering tank tops does not meet the requirement. Shirts for male students must meet the same requirements.
- Shirts must not be see-through, have offensive or explicit drug/alcohol/sexual images or verbiage.
- Shorts must have at least 4" inseam/not shorter than mid –thigh (measured by fully extended arm-bottom of thumb).
- Hair must be of natural colors (red, blonde, brown, black) and meet the requirements in the handbook.
- Pierced ears are allowed. Earrings may not be spiked nor are gauges allowed.
- Facial, tongue, or body piercings are not allowed to be worn at any time during the school day.
- Tattoos of any kind are not permitted and must be covered 100% of the school day.

Dress Code Shirts and Shorts will be given to students to wear who are not appropriately dressed for school. For a full explanation, please refer to your handbook. Examples of dress code violations:

- "Sagging" or holes in pants.
- Shorts that are too short.
- Shirts that are too low under the arms, in the front or that do not provide full coverage.
- Any shirt or clothing that contains inappropriate branding or content. i.e. SKIN, alcohol.



The young "tweens" who attend school at Andersen Junior High School must dress appropriately for a safe and fun learning environment. Learning is serious business and students are expected to dress and behave in a manner appropriate to both the environment and their age.

IMPORTANT!! NEWS REGARDING ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Parents, please be sure to note the **"Bring Your Own Technology"** agreement in the student agenda that you and your student will be required to sign. Students are allowed to bring personal electronic devices to school to use for appropriate instructional purposes only. Students will NOT be allowed to text, bully, play non-educational games, take photographs or videos of anyone to post online, or talk on cell phones during class, etc. Students are encouraged to personalize devices to make them easier to distinguish in case of loss. Remember that BYOT is a privilege, not a right, and abusing any policy will result in loss of the privilege. **Violation of the BYOT policy will result in the phone being taken away and requiring a parent or guardian to retrieve it.** AJHS/CUSD is not liable for losses due to theft or damage of electronic devices.
