What We're Learning

Reading- This week we will be reading: Click, Clack, Moo Cows That Type. We will be looking at answering the question: how can people and animals help each other? We will be focusing reading skills such as drawing conclusions, looking at author's word choice, and inferring to help better understand the text.

Writing- We will be working on writing a persuasive letter. They will be generating ideas about an item they would like to have for the classroom and persuade Ms. Hartman to allow them to have it in the classroom. Students will be working thru the writing process and publishing the letter to see if their persuasion worked.

Math- We will be having a fact assessment on adding five and six, doing our written assessment, identifying place value to hundreds by writing the numbers in expanded form, and adding two-digit numbers using mental computation. Just a reminder students will be bringing home homework daily so please be sure to check in with them and ask them about which topic we are studying.

Social Science and Science- We will be closing up our unit on magnets on Monday and Tuesday and heading into a unit on Ancient China.

Spalding- Students should be practicing their 30 spelling words. We will be testing on THURSDAY so, please be ready. We will also be introducing our spelling words for next week in class this week with our phonogram practice.

Grammar- We are working on identifying and writing compound sentences, my favorite.
