Course Overview

Course Description

BND710 Cadet Band (One Year): Cadet Band class is recommended for those who have been playing a band instrument for two years or less and is also open to beginning students who want to learn to play a band instrument. Most continuing band students from elementary school take this course. Students will continue to learn instrument-specific techniques, note recognition, rhythmic accuracy, sight-reading, and tonal development, as well as develop an appreciation of music history and expression. Students will perform several times throughout the school year for various concerts, school functions, and festivals.

Advanced Placement (AP) / International Baccalaureate (IB) / Dual Enrollment

Course Learning Outcomes

After this course, students will be able to:

perform fundamentals on their instrument according to third year standards, including: Developing understanding of various musical structure and context in repertoire performed, use feedback from ensemble peers and other sources to refine performances, and to demonstrate an awareness of the context of the music through prepared performances.

Materials and Fees

Course Materials

1. INSTRUMENT: Buy or rent from a local music store of your choice. If you need to inquire about renting a school instrument, please email Mrs. Bessette to apply (not all instruments are

available for school rental)

- 2. BOOK: Standard of Excellence by Bruce Pearson, Book 2 (blue) for your instrument.
- 3. FOLDER FOR MUSIC: Paper or plastic folders with pockets and 3 prongs, and 15 plastic sheet protectors for music. This will fit into a section in your PJHS binder but will be easily removable to put on your stand during rehearsals. You will need 2 of these to ensure proper care of your music all year.
- 4. ACCESSORIES FOR YOUR SPECIFIC INSTRUMENT:

Flute: Tuning/cleaning rod, cleaning cloth, small cleaning brush

Clarinet: Handkerchief swab, cork grease, 3 playable reeds brand Van Doren, mouthpiece brush, quality reed holder

*Suggested Mouthpiece: Van Doren M13 or B45, Rovner Ligature.

Saxophone: Handkerchief swab, 3 playable reeds brand Van Doren, cork grease, quality reed holder, mouthpiece brush

*Suggested Mouthpiece: Selmer C star

Trumpet: Valve oil (Al Cass), slide grease, cleaning snake and polishing cloth

*Suggested Mouthpiece: Bach 5C or 3C.

French Horn: Rotary oil, slide grease, mouthpiece brush, cleaning snake

*Suggested Mouthpiece: Giardinelli C8.

Trombone/Baritone: Trombotine slide oil, (Al Cass valve oil for baritones), tuning slide grease, cleaning snake, small spray bottle for water, mouthpiece brush, polishing cloth

*Suggested Mouthpiece: Bach 6-1/2 AL.

Tuba: Valve oil (Al Cass), slide grease, mouthpiece brush, cleaning snake

*SuggestedMouthpiece: Schilke 67

Percussion: Practice pad for home practice, at least 2 pairs of sticks, plastic (hard) mallets, yarn (soft) mallets

4. CONCERT ATTIRE: You will be responsible for providing your student's uniform, which is: white collared shirt, (dress shirt or polo) black dress pants, black dress shoes and socks.

Student Conduct, Success, and Responsibilities

Student Handbook

To be successful

students will be required to practice their instrument at home for 60 minutes a week. Weekly practice sheets must be signed by a parent/guardian and turned in the beginning of the week for the previous week's practice. Parents can request "exempt" by writing an explanation on the practice record for the week (i.e. family in town, on vacation, sick, etc.)

Student Responsibilities

Students are expected to participate in class rehearsals, with their instrument and music, every day they have band. Students that are unprepared for class (forgot instrument or music) or refuse to play/participate will be docked points for the day.

CONCERT ATTENDANCE IS MANDATORY! Concerts, field trip, and performance dates will be announced as soon as possible including an "Upcoming Events" notice given the first week of school. Please make sure you make arrangements for your student to attend all concerts and events! Failure to show up for a performance will result in a grade lowering of AT LEAST 2 LETTERS.

EXCUSED ABSENCES (PERFORMANCE): If you already have obligations made when a concert or performance is announced, you may request an excused absence for your child. Excused absences MUST be requested at least 2 weeks before the event, and your student will be given an alternate assignment. NO excused absences will be given for students within 2 weeks before the performance or to attend events that could be moved or excused. Late work

Students who are absent will be given adequate time to complete missing work. Points will be docked no more than 50% for late assignments.

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete a final at the end of the first and second semesters. The final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level).

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

Quarter grades

Quarter grades will be based on in-class rehearsal participation, practice records, playing tests (assessments) and performances (attendance).
