### **Course Description**

### Student Conduct, Success, and Responsibilities

#### **Student Handbook**

### To be successful

students will be required to practice their instrument at home for 60 minutes a week. Weekly practice sheets must be signed by a parent/guardian and turned in the beginning of the week for the previous week's practice. Parents can request "exempt" by writing an explanation on the practice record for the week (i.e. family in town, on vacation, sick, etc.)

#### **Student Responsibilities**

Students are expected to participate in class rehearsals, with their instrument and music, every day they have band. Students that are unprepared for class (forgot instrument or music) or refuse to play/participate will be docked points for the day.

CONCERT ATTENDANCE IS MANDATORY! Concerts, field trip, and performance dates will be announced as soon as possible including an "Upcoming Events" notice given the first week of school. Please make sure you make arrangements for your student to attend all concerts and events! Failure to show up for a performance will result in a grade lowering of AT LEAST 2 LETTERS.

EXCUSED ABSENCES (PERFORMANCE): If you already have obligations made when a concert or performance is announced, you may request an excused absence for your child. Excused absences MUST be requested at least 2 weeks before the event, and your student will be given an alternate assignment. NO excused absences will be given for students within 2 weeks before the performance or to attend events that could be moved or excused. #### Late work

Students who are absent will be given adequate time to complete missing work. Points will be docked no more than 50% for late assignments.

### **Assessments and Assignments**

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete a final at the end of the first and second semesters. The final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level).

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the <u>District Calendar</u>.

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

#### **Quarter grades**

Quarter grades will be based on in-class rehearsal participation, practice records, playing tests (assessments) and performances (attendance).

#### Semester grades
