Registration for next year

Begins January 7th

Online through Infinite Campus

- 10th Grade (for junior year)
- 4 core classes (English, Math, Science, History)
- 2 electives
- Zero hour, online options
- 11th Grade (for senior year)
- 3 core classes (English, Math, History)
- 1 or more electives to equal 4 or more credit bearing courses
- Zero hour is available, but does not count towards the 4 credit bearing courses for seniors, on-line options

- ✓ Students must be current on credits (12 total by end of 10th grade)
- ✓ Enroll by selecting EVIT as their electives during registration
- ✓ Students take 3 classes here in the morning and attend 3 classes at EVIT in the afternoon.
- ✓ Transportation is provided to and from EVIT's two campuses.
- ✓ EVIT will come on campus in March 2020 to register in person



- Given once a year in October (tomorrow)
- Offered to 9th, 10th, and 11th
- · Scores can indicate how you will do on the SAT
- Scores can lead to National Merit Scholarships (Junior year only)

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ACT VS SAT

- ACT
 - Given 6 times per year
 - · English, Math, Reading, Science Reasoning, and optional Writing
 - No penalty for wrong answer
 - · Juniors will test on campus Tuesday, April 7, 2020 for free
- - Given 7 times per year
 - · Reading, Math, and Writing
 - No longer a penalty for wrong answer
- · Take away
 - · Needed for most university admission, not needed for community college
 - Try both, take the one you like the best again
 - Prepare for the tests
 - · Take for the first time at the end of junior year

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


Understanding AP

- Next step after Honors courses
- Weighted grade
- o Prepares you for college
- Looks good on college application, rigor is higher than on level classes
- Chance to earn college credit (cheapest option available, \$91)
- Not guaranteed credit
 (Need to score at least a 3, 4, or 5)



- Earn college credit while attending high school classes
- Earn college credit that can fulfill many university general studies requirements
- Pay community college prices for university-level classes
 - (\$86 per credit hour)
- Credits usually transfer to your college of choice in state as direct course equivalents
- Guaranteed credit with a C or higher



Tips for Academic



- Plan ahead The in-state universities look at your unweighted Core GPA and/or test scores for admissions and scholarships. GPA Calculator https://www.cusd80.com/Page/20903
- · Keep your grades up! A "D" is considered a deficiency
- · Get involved, stay involved -quality over quantity
