

Allies...

ABC-1 Agreement:

Conference held in Jan. 1941 to discuss integration of US and British war goals

- Remove Italy from the Axis
- Build-up forces for the eventual offensive against Germany (2nd Front)
- Agreement that the Atlantic and European areas were the "decisive theater" and would be the primary focus of US military effort

Executive Order 9066:

Signed by President Roosevelt in 1942

Americans of Japanese decent had to register with the government and report to one of ten camps across the US Camps came to resemble small towns with their own post office, schools, and churches

Korematsu v. United States:

The defendants argued their fifth amendment rights were violated by the U.S. government

The Supreme Court ruled in favor of the U.S. government

War Production Board:

Agency that regulated the production and distribution of materials and fuel

Converted peacetime industries to meet war needs

Office of Price Administration

Agency that regulated prices and rationed certain supplies: Gas, meat, tires, nylon, sugar, silk, coffee

Smith-Connally Act:

Law that allowed the federal government to seize and operate industries threatened by or under strikes that would interfere with war production (Coal, Steel)

Congress overrode FDR's veto to pass





The Japanese enjoyed early successes in the Pacific. Allied forces were driven from:

Wake Island The Philippines British Malaya Dutch East Indies

By 1942, they controlled a vast empire rich w/ natural resources

Turning Point Battle in the Pacific in May 1942

1st "Carrier Battle"

Japanese expansion had been checked for the first time

Battle of Midway

Pivot Point in Pacific June 1942

After this Carrier battle, initiative shifted to Allies

US Navy and Marines begin "Island Hopping" through Pacific

- US forces bypass heavily fortified positions
- concentrate on strategically important islands capable of supporting the drive to the Japanese "Home Islands"

North Africa

In 1941 Hitler's armies were engaged on the Eastern Front against the USSR

Stalin begged for the Allies to open a 2nd front to provide some relief

Allied planners orchestrated an invasion of Europe through North Africa and Italy in 1942

Allied forces trap Rommel in Tunisia and force his troops to surrender

Rommel

In 1943, during the invasion of Sicily, Mussolini was deposed

Hitler's armies invaded Italy and stubbornly held out

June 4, 1944 Rome fell to Allied forces

"Unconditional Surrender" were the terms the Allies offered Germany in 1943 after FDR and Churchill met at Casablanca **D-Day**

June 6, 1944 Allies invade Normandy, France led by General Dwight Eisenhower

101st and 82nd Airborne troops parachuted into France behind enemy lines to capture bridges and other strategic spots

Allies launch a cross-channel invasion concentrating on the Normandy coastline

Largest invasion in human history involving over 3 million troops

"Battle of the Bulge"



2nd front causes Hitler's forces in East to be driven back into Germany

Hitler's Last Offensive: Battle of the Bulge

New weapons brought to fore: V2 Rockets Jet Airplanes

In April 1945, Soviet troops enter Berlin

Hitler's Last days


On April 27, Hitler married long-time mistress Eva Braun in the *Führerbunker* and then committed suicide with her 2 days later

V-E Day:

Hitler's suicide caused Germany's military to collapse

Fighting in Europe ended on May 7, 1945 when Hitler's successor, Karl Donitz, surrendered unconditionally






Iwo Jima

Japanese built bunkers w/ interconnected tunnel system (Home Islands)

110,000 Allied troops were used to invade the island including Navajo "CodeTalkers"



Manhattan Project



Code name for a group of physicists put together to create an "atomic weapon" lead by J. Robert Oppenheimer

Atoms accelerated

Electrons destroy bonds

Enormous amounts of γ energy released

Manhattan Project

Trinity: 1st Successful test July 6, 1945 in Alamogordo, NM

Little Boy: Aug. 6, 1945 dropped from B-29 *Enola Gay* on the Japanese city of Hiroshima (70-166k casualties)

Fat Man

Aug. 9, 1945 dropped from B-29 *Bockscar* on the Japanese city of Nagasaki (40-80k casualties)

Japanese capitulate on Aug 15, 1945

Signed Treaty ending WWII
