Spelling This week we will focus on the vowel, e (short e sound). We continue to work on building words, doing word sorts, and finding words that include short o in our daily readings. We also play "Spelling Sparkle" for practice, and the kids love it!

Spelling words this week: yet, web, pen, wet, leg, hen

Our challenge words are: bench, dentist, penmanship High Frequency Words to know: all, does, here, me, my, who

Vocabulary words your child will be introduced to: canvas, important, rhythm, combinations, row, ease

MS= Meets the Standard (80%-100%)

Writing We continue to work on sentences: building, unscrambling, and using a capital letter and proper ending punctuation. It is very important the kids learn these skills. Even with many reminders, they struggle remembering to apply it to their writing. When they work on homework, please make sure they use punctuation, proper spacing and a capital letter to begin every sentence. You'll see on their weekly dictation test if they are applying these skills regularly and independently.

<u>Social Science</u> This week we learn more about communities and their helpers.

<u>Math</u>

This week we are reviewing strategies for addition and reviewing previous concepts taught.



*During our math block we continually work on addition and subtraction facts any extra chance we get. Knowing basic math facts builds a strong foundation for harder concepts still to come. The students are expected to know addition facts 0-20. Anytime you are in the car or kitchen or doing things around the house, ask your child a math story problem such as..."If I just cut 5 slices of cheese, and then I cut 8 more slices, how many slices of cheese do I have in all?" Child's answer; "13 slices of cheese. 5+8=13." ~These little scenarios really help the kids get accustomed to math vocabulary and figuring out story problems which use higher order thinking skills!
