We will also focus on our writing skills as we respond to the literature we explore (essay, narrative, research, persuasive/argument). Key grammar and language elements will help guide our learning and communication skills.

Reading Focus: analyzing literary elements as a vehicle to gain a deeper comprehension of various texts.

<u>Writing Focus:</u> developing and organizing ideas in writing following MLA (Modern Language Association) across different domains (quick writes, summarizing, five-paragraph essays, research, etc.).




